### **About this Bird List**

Birdwatching is a captivating pastime with more and more people, young and old, becoming involved. There are many excellent bird books and identification field guides, including CALM's recently published *Bush Books* series to assist in distinguishing one bird from another. Volunteers with CALM's *LANDSCOPE* Expeditions have indicated a need for a State checklist to record bird sightings. Avid birdwatchers and beginners alike will find this list easy to use.

This checklist of Western Australian birds does not include rare vagrants. For a complete list of the birds recorded for the State readers should consult the "Checklist of the Birds of Western Australia 2000" by R.E. Johnstone published as a supplement of the *Records of the Western Australian Museum*. Naturalized species are indicated by an asterisk(\*). It should be noted that the Rainbow Lorikeet, although introduced in the south-west of the State, is native to the Kimberley.

This list will help you to maintain a record of birds observed, not only from your backyard, but from the many and varied habitats in the suburbs, southern forests, goldfields, deserts, Pilbara and Kimberley. Over time the species recorded can provide valuable information on species numbers, seasonal changes or fluctuations in distribution as well as information on times of breeding. Reliable, long-term observations from any area provide

useful information for developing conservation strategies. For the traveller, the checklist provides a convenient and permanent method of recording information that may otherwise be lost.

It is suggested that a new column be used for each locality or day of observation. Space is provided at the front of the booklet to record the area covered, route details or specific localities (including Global Positioning System (GPS) for latitudes and longitudes). A table is provided on page 31 for more detailed bird records including numbers observed and breeding information.

Although most native animals in Western Australia are nocturnal, a list of those more likely to be encountered on bush walks or at night while spotlighting, is included on pages 32 and 33. A list of the most common feral animals occurring in the State is provided on page 34. Space for any reptile records is provided on page 35.
