





Expenditure and revenue on conservation and land management














THE EFFECT OF TREE CROPS ON WATER TABLE LEVELS







Effect of chemical weed control on *Tree Crops*






Genetic Gains Trial:










Area of bluegums planted each year (CALM and APFL) and predicted wood flows



Investment to date:

□ \$20 million

Investment to complete plantation program:

□ \$30 million

Investment required for harvesting, transport and processing:

- ☐ \$20 million to upgrade facilities at Albany Port
- □ \$15 million for a mill to process the harvested logs
- □ \$3-4 million for a transport system
- □ \$16 million for harvesters
- □ \$12 million for loading machinery
- □ \$22 million for log trucks




The impact of fox control on Chuditch at Batalling forest






Numbat Sightings in Dryandra Forest




Brushtail Possum Response To Fox Control-Batalling Forest Block




Quenda Response To Fox Control Batalling Forest Block




