The badge showcases the spectacular flowers of Banksia cuneata, also known as the matchstick banksia. This species has been listed as Threatened, with a ranking of Endangered, as it has been found in only a handful of locations around the Western Australian wheatbelt region.

Matchstick banksia grows as a shrub or small tree to about four metres in height and has small, dark green, prickly cuneate (wedge-shaped) leaves. The species flowers in spring through to early summer, with the matchstick shaped pink and green flowers attracting many bird species.
