penicillata. Only one jaw of this species was recorded, but there appears to be no doubt about the identification. The Pseudomys sp. is not P. albocinereus, but is larger - it might be P. desertor. If it can be arranged, I propose to go back for another weekend and try and get some more material. P. albocinereus does not appear to have been on the islands, which is surprising. We did not apparently find any Lagorchestes; these might also be turned up on a second trip.

The two mice caught by Bert Wells are both Pseudomys hermannsburgensis and have now been accessed. Their numbers are M 10615 and M 10616. The bats collected last weekend are Eptesicus pumilus; their accession numbers are: male M 10620, females M 10621-3.
