Living with Possums

Western Ringtail Possums in backyards of the South West area

- Pseudocheirus occidentalis Western Ringtail Possum
- Listed as specially protected (threatened) under the Wildlife Conservation Act 1950
- Habitat is mainly Peppermint trees in the Busselton/Dunsborough/Margaret River area
- They enjoy eating a variety of leaves (mainly peppermints) including Melaleucas, Bottlebrushes and Wattle flowers
- Western Ringtail Possums will often live in roof cavities if they have no other habitat available
- Provide alternative accommodation e.g. possum nest boxes to avoid this occurring
- Prune trees and shrubs back from the house
- Block access to the roof cavity at night
- Backyard fences have become "Wildlife Corridors"
- This makes the possums vulnerable to predation
- Keep all cats inside at night (Busselton Shire's Cat Strategy)
- Restrain dogs at night, train to leave small animals
- Keep dogs on leash when out walking at night (Dog Act)
- When Western Ringtail Possums are eating your garden plants: e.g. roses, NZ xmas trees, daisies
- There are repellant suggestions that you can use (these are available on the internet):
- Lap Sang Souchong Tea
- Indonesian Fish Sauce
- Garlic Spray
- White King
- Camphor
- Wettable Sulphur
- Skunk-off ,Keep Off, Stay Off, Scat
- Eating garden plants give them alternative and preferrable food to eat e.g. Melaleucas, Bottlebrushes, Wattles in your garden
- Create your own "Wildlife Corridor" along fencelines so they have food, protection, homes and travel with their favourite plants
- They much prefer these and will leave your roofs and gardens alone

Removing Western Ringtail Possums from your roof or backyard:

- Western ringtail possums are territorial and prefer their patch
- Removing or translocating western ringtails to another place is quite often difficult as they may stress or be displaced
- If you remove a possum, another possum will usually take their place if you don't block the access
- Rather than remove wait till dark and they move from the roof
- Block off their entrance
- Make sure there is somewhere (Peppermint tree or other tree) for them to go in the yard
- Place a possum box in the tree
- The possum and you will be happy living together
