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1. Introduction

These reference lists for Garden Island and Cockburn Sound cover reports and publications produced subsequent to or additional to those listed by Environmental Management Services (1987) for the Department of Defence: *Reference lists for Cockburn Sound and Garden Island, Western Australia*, HMAS STIRLING Environmental Working Paper No. 1 (held by the Secretary Garden Island Environmental Advisory Committee).

The references are essentially those held in the environmental files at HMAS STIRLING and those cited in bibliographies in that material that were relevant to Garden Island or Cockburn Sound. References already listed in HMAS STIRLING Environmental Working Paper No. 1 are not included.

My objective has been to present the references in a consistent form, which has been complicated by the source bibliographies having been based on a number of different systems. I have used the Harvard referencing system and tried to keep to University of Western Australia Library guidelines for citing sources - see Internet site <http://www.library.uwa.edu.au/libinfo/citinghav.html>.

Some references have been included where the source details are inadequate but the material appears to be important.

Given that many of the references of relevance to studies of Garden Island have not been formally published, I compiled the lists on the basis of source and hopefully have included sufficient source information for the material to be accessed. A classification on the basis of subject would be an obviously useful approach but required more assessment of the material than was possible for this voluntary project.

The references are listed under six categories:

- Master List,
- Archival material from the State Library,
- Archival material from the National Library,
- Newspaper Articles,
- Films and Videos,
- Maps, Plans and Photographs.

The second column in each list gives the source of the reference, for either the document itself or the reference in its bibliography. Documents held by the GIEAC Secretary at HMAS STIRLING are listed as GIEAC, followed by a file heading and document number (in order of receipt), the headings being as follows (abbreviations used where space dictates):

- Environmental Working Papers (EWP)
- Land Management and Development (LM/D)
- Historical (H)
- General (G)
- Vegetation (V)
- Fauna (A)
- Arum Lilies (L)
- Research (R)

Documents held by the Environmental Manager are denoted as EM.

A number of references were drawn from the Southern Metropolitan Coastal Waters Study (Department of Environmental Protection 1996). This is noted in the second column as 'SMCWS' where listed in the directory of publication pp279-283 or 'SMCWS refs' where listed in the reference list pp255-277.

I have tried to give authorship to individuals rather than organisations wherever possible. In some cases two entries have been made and a note to this effect has been placed in the second column. Reports prepared for the Department of Defence have been authored according to the individual or organisation that produced them if possible. In some cases publications have also been listed under Department of Defence to facilitate access. In particular, Mr Peter Waterman has written many reports for Department of Defence concerning Garden Island, and he is listed as the author in some reference lists but elsewhere the same references are often credited to his company Environmental Management Services or to Department of Defence.
