One to two paragraph summary of achievements suitable for WATSNU		Funding has finally been obtained for the completion of the Goldfields Region Threatened Flora Management Plan. The plan has been in draft since 2006. The plan will be available to the public online, and is aimed at improving flora conservation efforts in the Goldfields region in the future.

Funding acquired for the completion of the Goldfields Region Threatened Flora Management Plan.

The Interim Recovery Plan for *Ricinocarpos brevis* was finalised in July 2011.

Ricinocarpos brevis seedling and seeding trials underway at Windarling Range.

A new monitoring program for *Tetratheca paynterae* subsp *paynterae* and *Ricinocarpos brevis* at Windarling Range was implemented.

The reintroduction of *Gastrolobium graniticum* to Gnarlbine Rock is underway, with more seed planted in May 2012. Results to date have shown that the seeds do not need fire to germinate therefore the recovery team advised not to carry out any more burning at the site.

17 species of threatened and priority flora were surveyed or monitored (totaling 20 populations), and 7 new populations of priority flora, were located.

Seed was collected from 3 species of threatened and priority flora and sent to the Threatened Flora Seed Centre for storage.
