Tetratheca spenceri (P1), only known population was surveyed and nominated for DRF. This was done as a joint project between Western Botanical (Geoff Cockerton is on the GTFRT) and Parks and Wildlife Goldfields Region.

The Goldfields Reference Herbarium moved to the Parks and Wildlife office in Kalgoorlie in May 2014. The Herbarium is well equipped with 1700 collections, a library and a computer with internet access.

2 populations of *Gastrolobium graniticum* (DRF), which grow around granite rocks west of Coolgardie were burnt in April 2015 to encourage germination,





	with funding received from a State NRM project.

Monitoring and survey of existing and new populations/ occurrences, targeted surveys, critical habitat mapped etc.	Two populations of DRF inspected/monitored (<i>Tetratheca paynterae</i> subsp. paynterae and <i>T. erubescens</i>), 4 populations of P flora inspected/monitored, 1 new population of P2 <i>Bossiaea laxa</i> found. <i>Ricinocarpos brevis</i> and <i>Tetratheca paynterae</i> subsp. paynterae monitoring conducted by Cliffs is ongoing. There had been no statistical change to <i>R. brevis</i> populations in 2014, however a 10% decline was observed in <i>T.pp</i> , Parks and Wildlife have inspected the population since this reporting and are monitoring the situation. A review of data for <i>Tpp</i> that has been collected over 10 years has been recommended.

The PEC 'Yellow sandplain communities of the Great Victoria Desert' was inspected in March 2015 as part of a Mulga Rocks/Vimy site inspection. Finalisation of the GTFMP is still ongoing.
