

CONDITIONS APPLYING TO SCIENTIFIC LICENSE NO.

This license shall authorise the holder to take protected fauna for bonafide research or other scientific purposes but not for aviculture or sale, and keep it in captivity subject to the following conditions which may be added to, suspended or otherwise varied as considered fit -

1. All holotypes of species and syntypes of subspecies and duplicates (one pair in each case) of any rare species (other than those mentioned in the 3rd sub-paragraph) shall be donated on request to the Western Australian Museum.
2. To prevent unnecessary collecting in this State, all specimens and material collected under the authority of this license shall, on request, be loaned to the Western Australian Museum.
3. This license shall not authorise the holder to take, or have in his possession, whether living or dead, or keep in captivity or confinement, any specimen of the species listed on the attached sheet as rare and likely to become extinct.
4. In the case of the Numbat or Banded Anteater, and of the Noolbenger or Honey Possum (Tarsipes spenserae) the collection shall be limited to two specimens of each animal.
5. In the case of the Black and White Wren (Malurus leucopterus), only one pair, a male and a female, may be taken.
6. No fauna whether dead or alive, shall be taken out of the State except by the authority of a license to export granted by the Chief Warden of Fauna for the State.
7. No fauna shall be taken from all that part of the State lying within a radius of 4 miles from Mt. Gardner situated east of Albany near Two Peoples Bay.
8. No specimens of the Numbat or Banded Anteater shall be taken from within the boundaries of the Dryandra State Forest, without approval in writing of the Chief Warden of Fauna.
9. No fauna shall be taken from any sanctuary without the approval in writing of the Chief Warden of Fauna.
10. No fauna shall be taken on any reserve set aside for the aboriginal inhabitants of the State except by permission in writing of the Commissioner of the Aboriginal Affairs Planning Authority.
11. Within one month of the expiration of this license (or at such later time as the Chief Warden may determine) the holder shall furnish to the Chief Warden of Fauna a return setting out in full detail the number of each species of fauna taken during the currency of the license, the locality where the species was taken and the method of disposal of such fauna.
12. The holder shall comply in all other respects with the provisions of the Fauna Conservation Act and Regulations.
