EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report summarises the major activities and outcomes of the project entitled *Report on 'A Representative Marine Reserve System for Western Australia'*, conducted as a cooperative project between the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority (GBRMPA) and the Department of Conservation and Land Management (CALM) of Western Australia, under funding from the Ocean Rescue 2000 Marine Protected Area Program 1994/95, Project No. G002/92, and administered by GBRMPA.

The objective of the program was an analysis, and preparation of a report thereon, of public submissions on the recommendations of the report of the Western Australia Marine Parks and Reserves Selection Group (MPRSWG) titled A Representative Marine Reserve System for Western Australia (CALM, 1994).

As with the companion study to this particular project (ie Ocean Rescue 2000 Project No. G020/96), since its inception there have been a number of major pioneering steps forward in marine conservation for Western Australia, culminating in the evolution of a new marine conservation framework that is underpinned by amendments to the CALM Act 1984 through the Acts Amendment (Marine Reserves) Act 1997. This project has made a significant contribution to the analysis and documentation of information in relation to some of the fundamental components of this framework. It has provided the resources to analyse the results of consultations with key stakeholders on the philosophical and technical basis of the MPRSWG's recommendations for a statewide system of representative multiple-use marine reserves and of the public submissions to the MPRSWG's recommendations and to prepare a report on the analysis of the public submissions.

1. Project brief

The objective of the program was an analysis, and preparation of a report thereon, of public submissions on the recommendations of the report of the Western Australian Marine Parks and Reserves Selection Working Group (MPRSWG) titled *A Representative Marine Reserve System for Western Australia* (CALM, 1994).

The main components of the project were as follows.

- To analyse the results of a consultation program with key stakeholders that sought their views on the
 philosophical and technical basis of the MPRSWG's report recommendations relating to the creation of
 a representative marine reserve system for Western Australia.
- To prepare a report on the analysis of the public submissions.

The project specifications are presented in Appendix 1.

The project funding totalled \$28,000 of which the OR2000 funding component was \$16,000 and the Department of Conservation and Land Management funding contribution was \$12,000.

2. RESULTS

The MPRSWG group report (CALM, 1994) was submitted to the Minister for the Environment in May 1994 and subsequently released in June of that year for public comment. The period of submissions ran until January 1995. During the public comment period CALM, with the contracted assistance of Murex Consultants Pty Ltd, conducted a series of public briefings in Western Australian coastal towns from Kununurra in the north to Esperance in the south and provided specific briefings to Local Government, the fishing, mining and petroleum industries, aboriginal groups and other community groups.

The submissions that were received during the public comment period were analysed and documented in the report titled: A Representative Marine Reserve System for Western Australia - Analysis of Public Submissions on the Report of the Marine Parks and Reserves Selection Working Group (CALM, 1997). The analysis of public submissions and preparation of the report were partly resourced via this project's funding.

A copy of the report is included as Appendix 2.
