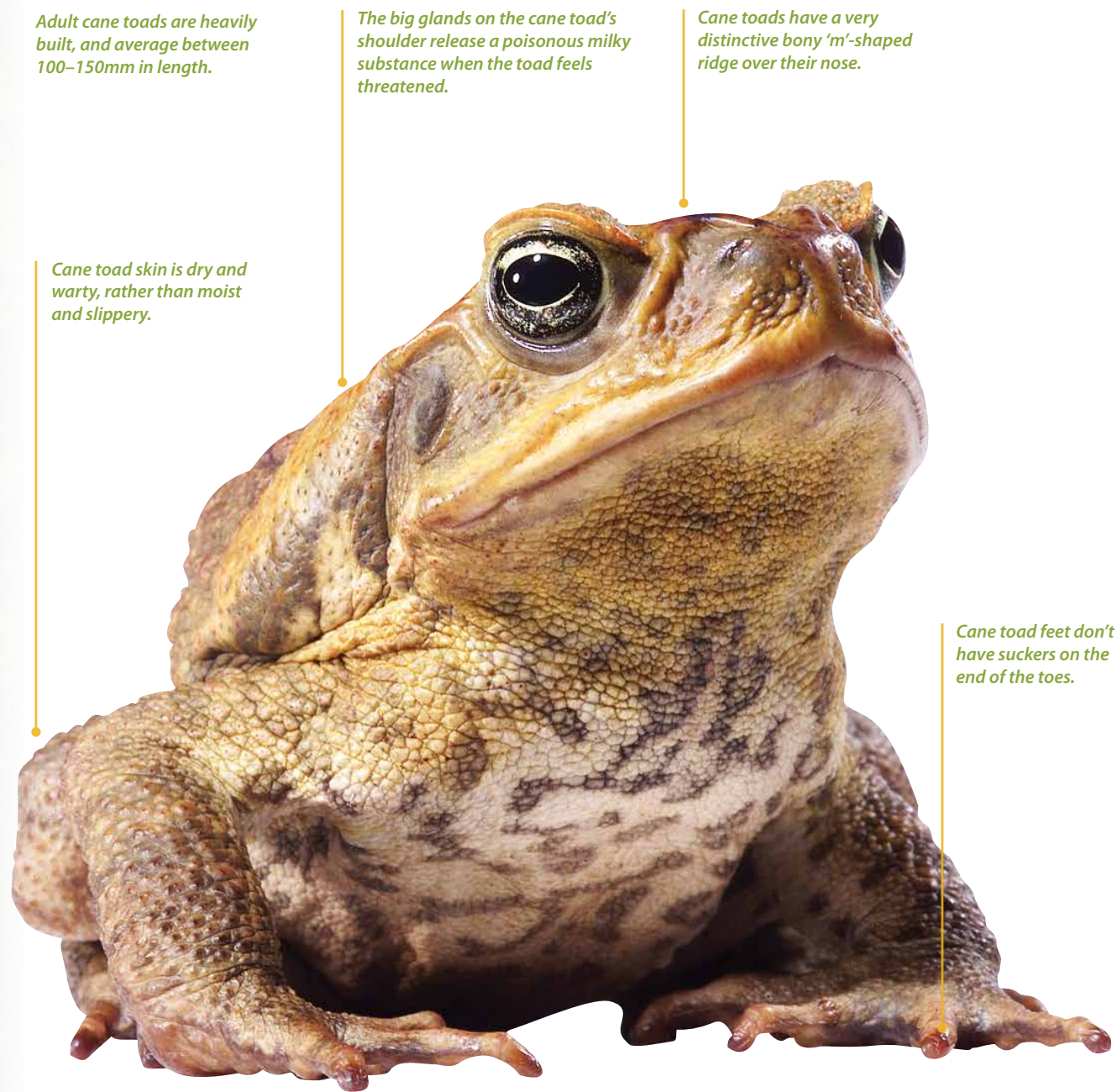

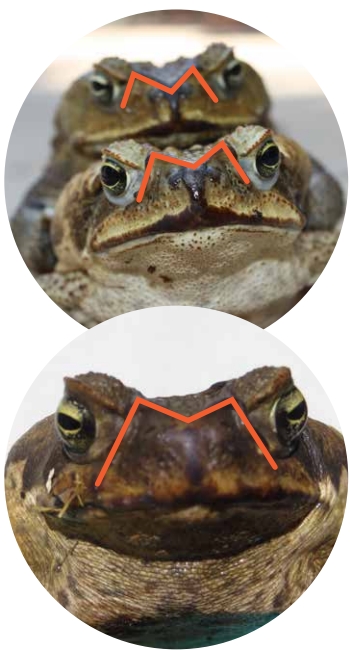
How to spot a toad



It can be really hard to tell the difference between frogs and toad eggs, tadpoles and metamorphs (babies). Before you euthanise any animals, check with the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions to make sure it is a cane toad.

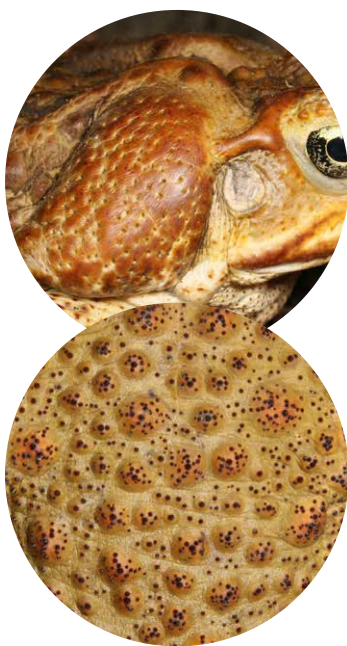
does your toad have
