Dear Sir,

Thank you for your advice of April 24 concerning Bands 12270 to 12276. I notice that you say that these were all placed on Frey Teal at Norm Thite's farm on Tilliams Location 4551. Unfortunately, you haven't told us the date when each was banded. As you have previously indicated that these were all used at your brother's farm we will have to adjust our records, if your last advice is correct.

It seems quite apparent to me that it was unfair of us to ask you to carry out this banding work which has to be done absolutely meticulously. As we have our own banding unit now, consisting of two full-time technical assistants directed by a graduate research officer, we will be able to band all the birds necessary on a scientifically calculated programme. I will have a warden call on you in the not too distant future, therefore, and pick up from you the unused bands. These will be required by our own workers as the special monometal bands we had made for our programme have proved unsatisfactory we will have to resort to using the aluminium ones until a new batch can be ordered.

I must take this opportunity to thank you very sincerely for all the effort you have put into banding and to assure you that we will certainly continue to advise you of the date and place where any of your bands are recovered.
