Actually the band was placed on a Black Duck at Wardering Lake on March 13 of this year by Mr L. Bell and N.A. Beeck, assisted by Fauna Warden N. McLaughlan. I might be mis-reading your writing and you could have meant "widgeon", but that name is usually a synonym for the Pink-eared Duck.

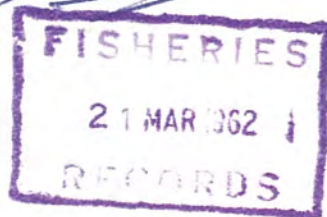

As is usual in such cases, we sought the assistance of the Scientific Officers of the Criminal Investigation Branch of the Police Department who are experienced in techniques used to "bring up" numbers originally stamped on metal and later eroded or filed away. By this means it was discovered that the band you forwarded was numbered 3214.

Our records disclosed that the above-mentioned band was placed on a grey teal at Yealering, on the 25.1.55. When you recovered it on the 19th April, 1962, it was in its eighth year of banding - a truly remarkable record.

Thank you for returning the band and for so patiently awaiting the banding details. I am sorry it took so long, but these things are not altogether within our control.
