<b>BASIC JOB STEPS</b>	<b>POTENTIAL ACCIDENTS/HAZARDS</b>	<b>CORRECTIVE ACTION</b>
Serving visitors at the entry station	Dehydration	Drinking lots of water or electrolyte drinks.  Keeping as cool as possible to avoid excessive perspiration ( Stay in shade when possible)
	Sunburn	Wearing cool, protective clothing such as a shirt with collar and long sleeves. Wearing a broad brimmed hat that shades your head, neck, face and ears Applying SPF30+ sunscreen before exposure to sunlight as well as on overcast days - noses, lips, ears, necks and backs of hands need extra protection.
	Heat stroke	Taking rest breaks in a cool place  Sunscreen should be reapplied regularly
