## PAINTINGS FOR THE STATE.

## Late Lady Bedford's Collection.

A collection of about seventy-live large water colours of wild flowers, made by the late Lady Bedford, wife of the late Admiral Sir Frederick C. D. Bedford, who was Governor of Western Australia from 1903 to 1909, has been presented to the State Herbarium by her three sons and daughter. daughter.




About sixty of these paintings were received on loan from Lady Bedford in 1929 on the occasion of the State Centenary celebrations, when they were exhibited in Perth, and attracted some attention. Miss Constance Miller, of Cottesloe, a friend of Lady Bedford, who was responsible for the introduction of the pictures at that time, arranged subsequently with Captain Denham M. T. Bedford, of the Royal Navai Gunnery School, Chatham, in accordance with Lady Bedford's wish that the pictures be donated to some botanical institution, to have tuese studies presented to tution, to have these studies presented to the State Herbarium.

Last week the Government Botanist Mr. C. A. Gardner) received two parcels of water colours from Captain Bedford, with the following note:—"Will you please a fift from Admiral A. E. F. Bedford, P. H. Bedford, Egg., Mrs. C. Pearse, and captain D. M. T. Bedford, R.N., sons and aughter of the late Sir F. and Lady Bedford."

The pictures are excellent representations of the flowers of South-Western custralia, and include about seventy species. They exhibit wonderful accuracy of form and colour, and are amongst the nest work of this kind yet executed. One fithem is from the brush of Admiral Sir rederick Bedford, examples of whose ork are found in the Perth Art Gallery, and depicts the red-flowered banksia of Ibany. It is remarkable for its bold outle and colour, imparting a characteristic gidity which is usually lacking in such presentations. Lady Bedford's work inudes a study of the "Southern Cross over," also from Albany, and some vivid presentations of several other plants, stably the Qualup Bell, the Red Leschenltia, Kangaroo Paws and many orchids. The collection will be housed in the ate Herbarium, and when accommodame becomes available it is proposed to ver the studies suitably framed.
