

Project Background





- Increase in demand for off-road cycling trails and facilities.
- February 1999 Trailswest/Lotteries funding committed to produce Proposed Long Distance Bike Trail Development Plan
- April 2000 Development Plan completed.
- May 2000 CALM endorsed in principal the Development Plan pending further negotiations with stakeholders and final approval by the Conservation Commission.



Project Background





Cont...

- July 2000 CALM agrees to manage Trail Development subject to external funding availability.
- September 2000 Lotteries funding approved for first stage of project Mundaring to Collie.
 Granted to Friends of Hardwood Trail
- February 2001 CALM Project coordinator seconded funded initially by Local Government contributions to project.



Naming the Trail



- January 2000 Interested WA
 Mountain Bike Assoc. (WAMBA)
 members sought to name the trail and
 provide support for trail development
- March 2000 "Hardwood Trail"
- March 2001 Consensus amongst the community that trail needs to be rebadged to something more unique to WA. Munda Biddi, a Nyoongar term meaning 'path through the forest'...



Benefits to WA







- Greater Eco-tourism and employment opportunities for South West towns.
- Unify rural communities along the cycling route.
- Provides a safe and accessible 'bush' touring route linking forest towns and features.
- Reduce the impacts of bikes on walking trails i.e. Bibbulmun Track



Project Schedule





Stage 1 - Mundaring to Collie Late, 2003

Opened - Mundaring to Dwellingup (December 2003)

- Stage 2 Collie to Pemberton
 Proposed completion (Late, 2003)
- Stage 3 Pemberton to Albany
 Proposed completion (Late, 2004)



Funding and Partnerships









- Estimated cost of development (Stage 1)+ \$550,000 (Planning and Construction)
- Existing Funding for the Trail Project\$520,000


Funding bodies

- Trailswest Funding Program (Lotteries)
- CAFÉ (Alcoa/CALM Funding Program)
- New Parks Program (State Government)
- Secure funding for Stages 2 & 3(Collie to Albany)



Facilities - At a Glance

- Town or campsite every 35-40km (visiting a town every 2-3 days)
- 5-purpose built 'cycle friendly' campsites between Mundaring and Collie
- Regular Distance markers
