









Species Extinctions Since European Settlement in 1829 (After Armstrong and Abbott, 1995)



Recent Mammal Extinction (Australia Leads the World)





















































Comparison between Cumulative Cats Captured and Monthly Average Cat Track Counts




Note: Cat Tracks Above 60 Tracks per 100 kms are difficult to physically estimate

Fox Control Treatments in the Northern Jarrah Forest (Operation Foxglove)

Treatment	Area (ha)
2 baitings per year	221 400
4 baitings per year	130 400
6 baitings per year	88 600
Unbaited control	103 500

—unbaited control — 2 baitings/year — 4 baitings/year — 6 baitings/year












Total area of *E. globulus* in WA
