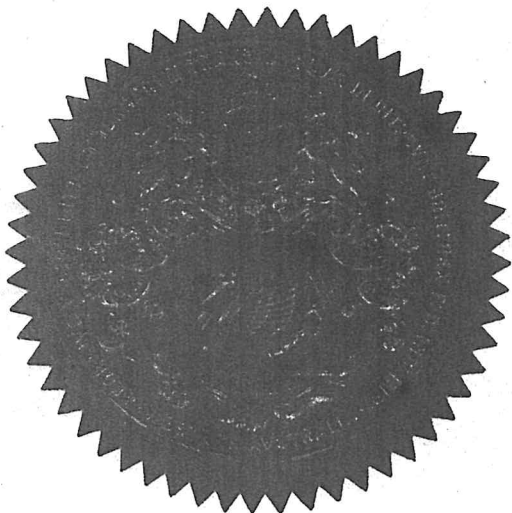

By His Excellency Major General Sir Harry Barron, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.



W H E R E A S by The Game Act, 1912-13, it is provided that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation, declare any one or more portions of the State or any one or more localities to be respectively defined in such Proclamation a Reserve for Native Game or any particular Native Game: NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby with the advice of the Executive Council declare that the portions of the State and localities mentioned and defined in the Schedule hereto shall be a Reserve for Native Game.
