Catchment Carers' Trail

In support of the Waterwise Schools Program

Primary students, Years 5, 6 & 7



The program at a glance

The Catchment Carers' Trail (CCT) is a learning program about the water cycle, water catchment protection and forest resource management. It can include a teacher professional development (PD) day (18 March, 5 August), activities at school and an excursion.

A CCT booklet

A booklet for pre and post-visit activities at school will be forwarded to teachers when booking the excursion. Booklet is also available for down-loading from CALM's NatureBase website (www.naturebase.net).

Pre and post-visit activities at school

Teachers may use the booklet and the Water Corporation's water education topic booklets.

Student excursion

A two-kilometre interactive walk trail led by EcoEducation Officers. There are nine activity stations addressing forest management issues such as salinity, erosion, nature conservation, the water cycle, mining and fire. A tour of Mundaring Weir, its history and use as part of an integrated water system.
