





ONCE IN A LIFETIME2002 ECLIPSE EXPEDITION

On the afternoon of 4 December 2002 a total solar eclipse will be visible from a select region of South Australia. On this day the Earth, Moon and Sun will come into perfect alignment. At the precise time of alignment the Moon will cover up the Sun and will temporarily turn day into night. Join Perth Observatory astronomers on this expedition, who will provide expert assistance for participants to safely witness this spectacular event.

Total solar eclipses are quite rare; the last one visible from Western Australia occurred in 1974, and the next is due in 2023. From Perth, this eclipse will appear partial, and only have 85% of the Sun covered at maximum.
