The Jarrah Forest Ecosystem

Explore the dry sclerophyllous ecosystem of the jarrah forest with experienced Department of Conservation and Land Management Education Officers.

## The one-day field trip can include:

- landform-soil-plant associations;
- fire, its history and role;
- human impacts and forest management issues including dieback disease and threatened species;
