# Wild About Wildflowers


Yanchep's wildflower gardens are at their best during spring. Numerous species of banksia, featherflower, kangaroo paw and hakea can be seen among other plants.

The wildflower gardens were created by sustenance workers in the 1930's. In the early 1970's, the gardens were further developed to enable Yanchep's visitors to experience the range and beauty of the wildflowers of the State's national parks. Rangers were sent out to many national parks to collect representative soils and plants. In 1988 the northern suburbs branch of the Wildflower Society of WA became involved with the park and the wildflower gardens.

Get off the beaten track, explore the Swan Coastal Plain and discover some of Western Australia's stunning wildflowers. Look out for the Candle, Bull and Firewood Banksia, kangaroo paws and catspaws Donkey and Cowslip orchids and the Yanchep Rose, to name a few.

One of the best places in Yanchep National Park to see the Yanchep Rose (Diplolaena angustifolia) is on the northern side of the the car park near Crystal Cave, and the best time, September.

### Historical Yanchep Inn Back In Business

Yanchep Inn has reopened to the public after major upgrade.

CALM undertook a \$300,000 improvement program under a conservation plan for the historic inn endorsed by the Heritage Council of WA. The work included improvements to the bar areas, extensive electrical upgrading, water proofing the building and a completely renovated kitchen area. The exterior of the building also was repainted.

Environment Minister Cheryl Edwardes attended an afternoon tea to celebrate the opening of this historical inn. Mrs Edwardes said the inn, a particularly popular spot in the park would provide a full food and bar service.

Motel units also had been upgraded to provide accommodation.

The upgrading of the inn is part of an overall program to improve the recreation facilities for the enjoyment of all visitors.

# Coastal Plains Walk Trail



Walkers of the Perth metropolitan are and beyond will soon be able to experience the magic, colour and tranquillity of the Swan Coastal Plain.

Stage One is now under construction with the development of the first 45km from Yanchep National Park, passing through some of our picturesque State Forest to Melaleuca Conservation Park in the south.

This trail is another welcome boost tot he nature based tourism facilities in the north metropolitan region of Perth.

The trail will provide a new low impact recreational opportunity showcasing our unique coastal flora and fauna. Walkers will be set to experience and see some of the Swan Coastal Plains peaceful wetlands, tuart and banksia woodlands, coastal views, spectacular sprays of wildflowers, forest fauna and glimpses of Darling escarpment.

The trail has been designed to cater for all members of the community. There are opportunities for day walks for beginners and three day treks for the more experienced bush walkers.

The development of this new and exciting trail was a joint initiative between the North West Metro Tourism Association and the Department of Conservation and Land Management. Stage One was primarily funded by a Eco-Tourism grant from the Commonwealth Department of Science and Tourism, under a

Backspacer grants program. The Coastal Plain Walk Trail blooms spectacularly with its diversity of wildflowers almost all year round. Special features are the coastal smokeless and Morrison feather flower.

Keep an eye and ear out for the western grey kangaroo, brush wallaby, echidna, quenda, western pygmy possum and honey possum. The birdlife will also delight you; at early morning you may hear twenty Eight parrots, magpies, ravens, we\wrens, honey eaters, and the hovering kestrels. You will have no problem sighting the flocks of Carnaby's whitetailed black cockatoos, or tracing the emu prints int he sand. Keep a special lookout for the white-striped mastiff bat, which dwells in the cave overhangs at Yanchep. It puts out a high piercing call.

Trail brochures are available from the McNess House Visitor Centre at Yanchep National\ Park. The trail is well worth the effort!




