

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### PLEASE NOTE

Fees received for Duck Shooters' Licences are credited to the Nature Conservation and National Parks Trust Account. This fund assists in financing conservation projects such as the annual monitoring of waterfowl abundance, waterbird habitat surveys, and research on endangered species of fauna and flora.

During the season, Wildlife Officers will be requesting shooters to give their names, addresses and licence numbers together with information on species shot and numbers of ducks taken. This information will be analysed by the Department's research staff and the results will be published. Your co-operation in this survey will be greatly appreciated.


### DUCK SHOOTING IN THE SOUTH

### Open Season - Dates and Locations

In the South West and Eucla Land Divisions (see map below), the 1990 duck shooting season opens at 6.00 am on Sunday 14 January 1990 and closes at 7.15 pm on Sunday 11 February 1990.

### Night Shooting

Shooting is prohibited between the hours of 7.15 pm and 5.30 am each day during the duck shooting season.



Boundaries of the South West and Eucla Land Divisions

Outside the South West and Eucla Land Divisions, an open season for wild ducks applies throughout the year. See pages 21 and 22 for the conditions applying in this area.

### Licences

No person may take, or attempt to take, any wild ducks unless he is the holder of a current Duck Shooter's Licence. Licences may be obtained from offices of the Department of Conservation and Land Management (see page 23). The licence fee is \$15.00.

### Bag Limit

No person may take more than a total of five ducks per day of any game species or combination of game species.

Possession Limit

Game species:

five ducks On the first day of the open season: After the first day of the open season: ten ducks

### NOTE

- The possession limit does not permit the taking of any more than five ducks in any one day, but permits shooters to have the equivalent of two days' bag limit in their possession if they have been shooting over a two-day period after the opening day. 1 -
- No person may possess or transport a duck unless at least one fully-feathered wing is attached to the bird and that wing and plumage may only be removed from the duck when: 2
  - the bird is prepared for immediate cooking; or
- after the bird is taken to the residence of its owner for pres-(a) (b) ervation.
- Bag limits may not be pooled. 3.

Wild ducks may only be taken whilst in flight and only when flying higher Methods of Capture than 3 metres above water or ground level, using a licensed shotgun fired from the shoulder, except as may be necessary to kill a wounded game bird (see regulation 49(5)(c) on page 19).

Because of the danger to other shooters from large shot, the maximum shot size used should not be greater than number 4.

It is illegal to use any motor vehicle, power boat, aircraft or other device to drive ducks over or in front of shooters or to use any boat, canoe, raft etc. powered by any means other than by hand, for the purpose of taking or attempting to take wild ducks. In the case of Game Reserves, the use of any boat whatsoever is illegal (see page 18).

Electric torches, spotlights or lamps may not be used in the taking

of ducks. Traps and snares may not be used for taking ducks.

Explosive devices may not be used for taking ducks.

WARNING It is an offence to shoot any bird which cannot be positively identified as a game bird.

Other Restrictions

Wild ducks may not be kept in captivity. Eggs of any wild duck may not be taken. The sale of wild ducks is forbidden. Fauna other than ducks may not be hunted or disturbed.

### Litter

11. il: 111:

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11 i i It is illegal to deposit any litter or rubbish on any reserve, remove soil or vegetation, light fires or disturb or hunt any fauna other than game species.

OFFENDERS WILL BE PROSECUTED - please take along a large rubbish bag on your hunting trip and leave your hunting area litter-free.

(For other specific rules on activities in those reserves which are open to duck shooting see regulation 49 on page 18.)

### CLOSED AREAS

There are two types of areas where duck shooting is totally prohibited at all times:

- General Areas 1.
- Waterfowl Refuge Areas 2.

### GENERAL AREAS (Closed to shooting) 1.

ALL NATURE RESERVES. (other than game reserves listed on pages 14 to 18).

All National Parks.

All State Forests, timber reserves, reservoirs, and other areas where shooting is prohibited under the provisions of any Act, regulation or by-law.

All cities and towns in the South West and Eucla Land Divisions.

The whole of the area within a radius of 32 km of the G.P.O. Perth.

SHOOTERS ARE REMINDED THAT IT IS ILLEGAL TO SHOOT ON OR OVER PRIVATE OR LEASEHOLD LAND WITHOUT THE EXPRESS PERMISSION OF THE OWNER OR LESSEE.

### WATERFOWL REFUGE AREAS (Closed to shooting) 2.

TOWN OF ALBANY

The whole of the waters of Lake Seppings and all land within 400 metres of its shores.

ALBANY SHIRE

The whole of the waters of Nannarup (or Taylor) Inlet and all land within 400 metres of its shores.

The whole of the waters of the King and Kalgan Rivers and all land within 400 metres of their banks.

The whole of the waters of Oyster and Princess Royal Harbours and all land within 400 metres of their shores.

The whole of reserve 27157 adjoining the water catchment area in Cheyne Road.

The whole of the waters of Lake Powell (Grassmere) and all land within 400 metres of its shores.

### CITY OF ARMADALE

The whole of reserve A24781 (Lake Forrestdale).

### BOYUP BROOK SHIRE

The whole of the area within a radius of 4 kilometres of the Post Office at Boyup Brook.

### BUSSELTON SHIRE

The whole of the waters of Vasse and Wonnerup Estuaries and all land within 400 metres of their shores.

The whole of reserve 31188, including the Sabina River from Bussell Highway downstream to the Vasse Estuary.

The whole of the waters of the Vasse River and all land within 400 metres of its banks.

The whole of reserve 27080 in the Broadwater.

### CAPEL SHIRE

All that portion of the Capel River between the Capel and Stirling Bridges and all land within 400 metres of the river's banks.

### CHITTERING SHIRE

The whole of the waters of Lakes Needoonga and Chittering, and all land within 400 metres of their shores (Reserve 29538).

### CORRIGIN SHIRE

The whole of reserves 12899 and 12900 (Paper Bark) at Nambadilling. The whole of reserve 30324 (Lake Kurrenkutten).

### DANDARAGAN SHIRE

The whole of Caro Swamp and all land within 1.6 kilometres of its shores.

The whole of reserve 28558 (Namming Nature Reserve also known as Crackers Swamps).

### DARDANUP SHIRE

That section of the Collie River from the junction of the Collie and Brunswick Rivers to a line drawn in a northerly direction across the river from the north-eastern corner of Wellington Location 424 and including all land within twenty metres of the river between these points.

### DENMARK SHIRE

All that part of Wilson Inlet situated between the low water mark at Ratcliffe Bay (Southern Ocean) and a line joining the southernmost extremity of reserve 12344 and north-eastern corner of Plantagenet Location 1828.

### DONNYBROOK-BALINGUP SHIRE

The whole of the area within a radius of 2.4 kilometres from the Post Office at Balingup.

### DUMBLEYUNG SHIRE

All that portion of the Coblinine River downstream from the eastern side of the bridge at the junction of road 3375 and road 323 (Oxley Road) to the prolongation eastwards of the southern boundary of Kojonup Location 3928 and all land within 400 metres of that part of the river's banks.

The whole of Lake Dumbleyung (Reserves 5999 and 26664) and all land within 400 metres of its high water mark.

### GINGIN SHIRE

The whole of the waters of Lake Nambung, Bambun and Mungala and all land within 400 metres of their shores (Reserve 24257).

The whole of reserve 26756 including Wallering Swamp.

The whole of the waters of Lake Wannamal north of the easterly prolongation of the southern boundary of Swan Location 2150.

The whole of Mogumber Nature Reserve (A38649 formerly known as Swan Location 2118) and adjoining Swan Locations 2117 and 3155 (approximately 3 km north of Lake Wannamal).

GREENOUGH SHIRE

The whole of reserve 7276 (Devlin's Pool) and Ellendale Pool.

HARVEY SHIRE

See MANDURAH SHIRE.

JERRAMUNGUP SHIRE

The whole of the land and waters contained within reserves 21646 and 21647 in the Wellstead and Beaufort Estuaries respectively.

MANDURAH REGION

Refer to map on page 11.

All water of the Peel Inlet and the Harvey Estuary and all land within 400 metres of their high water mark.

The whole of the area within a radius of 4.8 kilometres of the Post Office at Mandurah.

The whole of the area within a radius of 2.4 kilometres of the southwest corner of Murray Location 1532 including the mouths of the Serpentine and Murray Rivers.

All that part of the Murray River downstream to its mouth from the Ravenswood Bridge and all land within 400 metres of its riverbanks.

The whole of Goegrup (Willies) Lake, south of Stake Hill Bridge and that portion of the Serpentine River, south of the lake to the confluence of that river with Peel Inlet, and all that land within 400 metres of the lake's edge and river bank.

The whole of reserve 4990 on the east side of Peel Inlet.

The whole of reserve 2707 adjoining Robert Bay (south side of Peel Inlet).

The whole of reserve 24036 adjoining Austin Bay (south-east side of Peel Inlet).

The whole of reserve 28087 (Nirimba Cay) in Peel Inlet.

All that part of the Harvey Estuary lying south and south-east of a line drawn from the southernmost point of the eastern boundary of Murray Location 372 to the northernmost point of the western boundary of reserve 2990 and all land within 400 metres of that part of the included shoreline and further including the whole of reserve A23756 and the whole of Murray Location 1209 and 720.

All that part of the Harvey River from the prolongation eastwards of the southern boundary of Murray Location 720 to the confluence of that river with the Harvey Estuary and all land within 400 metres of that part of the river's banks.

The whole of reserve 39404 (Lake McLarty, also known as Big Lake).

The whole of reserves A24739 and A2738 (Mealup Point Nature Reserve) on the eastern shore of Harvey Estuary near Lake McLarty (Big Lake).

The whole of reserve 36126 on the banks of the Harvey River.

The whole of the Harvey Catchment area.

The whole of reserve 22057 on the east side of Lake Preston.


The whole of Yalgorup National Park including Lake Clifton, Lake Preston, the Martin Tank chain of lakes, the Swan Pond, the Duck Pond, Boundary Lake, Lake Pollard, Martin's Tank Lake, Lake Yalgorup, Lake Haywood and Lake Newnham.

That area of Benger Swamp included in, and the land within 50 metres, as defined by the following: from the north-east corner of Reserve 34811, south along Drain Reserve No. 26224; west along Swamp Road to the north-western corner of Lot 39 Plan 3466 of Wellington Location 1; then south to West Lane along the western boundary of Lot 39; then west along West Lane to the south-western corner of Lot 108 Plan 3466 of Wellington Location 1; then north to the north-west corner of Reserve 34811; then east along the northern boundary on Reserve 34811 as marked on map, page 9.


All that section of the Collie River from the junction of the Collie and Brunswick Rivers to a line drawn in a northerly direction across the river from the north-eastern corner of Wellington Location 424 and including all land within twenty metres of the river between these points.


All those waters of the Leschenault Inlet extending southwards from a line drawn south-east from Waterloo Head (Belvedere), on the west foreshore to a point on the opposite foreshore and all land within 400 metres of the included foreshores.

NOTE

It is illegal to shoot on or over private or leasehold land or to trespass on such land without the express permission of the owner or lessee.

The whole of the waters of Black Lake (which includes Kogarup, Salt, Walyannup, Bulbeaver and Road Lakes) and all land within 400 metres of its shores and further including all waters and all land lying between Black Lake and the Serpentine River.

All of those waters and all land within 400 metres either side of the high water mark of the western shore of that part of the Peel Inlet and the Harvey Estuary lying south of a radius of 4.8 kilometres from the Post Office at Mandurah and lying north of Island Point located within Reserve 2990.

The whole of reserve 2517 (Byrd Swamp Nature Reserve).

### MANJIMUP SHIRE

All that part of Lake Muir Nature Reserve (No. 31880) lying north and east of a line drawn from the north eastern corner of Nelson Location 1330 to the nothernmost point of Nelson Location 9246, as shown on the map at page 9.

The rest of the Nature Reserve has been declared a hunting and shooting area.

### MUNDARING SHIRE

The whole of the waters of Lake Leschenaultia and all land within  $400\,\mathrm{metres}$  of its shore.

### MURRAY SHIRE

See MANDURAH REGION.

### NORTHAM SHIRE

All that portion of the Avon River and all land within 400 metres of the river banks from the Northam Townsite downstream through the Toodyay townsite to the westernmost boundary of Avon Location 3 (near Cobbler Pool).

### NORTHAMPTON SHIRE

The whole of reserve 28750 at the Murchison River Bridge.

All the waters at the Murchison River and that area of land within 400 metres of either side of the river from the river mouth upstream to Murchison House Homestead (plus the townsite of Kalbarri in its entirety).

ROCKINGHAM SHIRE

The whole of the Shire of Rockingham.

TAMBELLUP SHIRE

The whole of reserve 25194 including Anderson Lake.

TOODYAY SHIRE

All that portion of the Avon River and all land within 400 metres of the river banks from the Northam townsite downstream through the Toodyay townsite to the westernmost boundary of Avon Location 3 (Cobbler Pool).

WAGIN SHIRE

The whole of the waters of Lake Wagin and all land within 400 metres of its shores (Reserve 13279).

The whole of Lake Dumbleyung (Reserves 5999 and 26664) and all land within 400 metres of its high water mark.

CITY OF WANNEROO

The whole of the Yanchep National Park.

The whole of the Waters of Lake Joondalup and all land within 400 metres of its shores.

The whole of Reserve A24581 including Lake Nowergup.

The whole of the waters of Lake Jandabup and all land within 400 metres of its shores (Reserve 7349).

WAROONA SHIRE

See MANDURAH REGION.

WEST ARTHUR SHIRE

The whole of the waters of Lake Towerinning and all land within 400 metres of its shores (Reserve 24917).

WICKEPIN SHIRE

The whole of the waters of Lake Yealering and all land within 400 metres of its shores.

The whole of the waters of Lake Toolibin and all land within 400 metres of its shores (Reserve A24556).

### WOODANILLING SHIRE

The whole of the waters of Little Murapin Lake and all land within 400 metres of its shores (Reserve 24912).

The whole of the waters of Wandering Lake and all land within 400 metres of its shores (Reserve A17258).

### YORK SHIRE

All that portion of the Avon River and all land within 400 metres of that part of the river's banks from the Burges' Siding Road Bridge upstream to the southwestern corner of Lot 10 (approx. 600 metres upstream).

### Game Reserves - Regulations


The following regulations are applicable to nature reserves gazetted as hunting and shooting areas:

### WILDLIFE CONSERVATION REGULATION 49

- (1) For the purposes of these regulations ''game reserve'' means any nature reserve or wildlife sanctuary or part or parts thereof classified as a shooting or hunting area pursuant to the provisions of the Act.
  - (2) Notwithstanding any other provisions of these regulations to the contrary, it shall be lawful for a person who is the holder of a current licence to take game species issued pursuant to these regulations to:
    - (a) enter upon a game reserve for the purpose of lawfully taking game;
    - (b) to then have in his possession a firearm known as a shotgun for which he holds a current licence issued pursuant to the Firearms Act, 1973;
    - (c) to then have under his control a dog trained as a gundog and registered under the Dog Act, 1976;
    - (d) to take such numbers and species of game by means of such a shotgun, with or without a gun-dog, as may be lawfully permitted pursuant to the Act and these regulations,

- (3) A person shall not, in the taking of game, use in any game reserve any launch, boat, canoe, raft, or other type of boat of whatsoever kind, whether it is propelled by mechanical power or not.
- (4) A person shall not attempt to shoot any game bird in any game reserve unless he may reasonably expect to recover it if it is killed or wounded.
- (5) A person shall not in any game reserve -
  - (a) shoot in such a manner as may cause any fauna other than a game bird to be killed or wounded;
  - (b) shoot at any bird he is unable to identify positively as a game bird;
  - (c) shoot at any bird which is not clearly flying higher than 3 metres above the water or ground level, whether a game bird or not, except as may be necessary to kill a wounded game bird;
  - (d) discharge or operate a firearm in a dangerous, threatening or frightening manner;
  - (e) have in his possession any firearm other than a shotgun licensed pursuant to the Firearms Act, 1973;
  - (f) have in his possession any firearm whatsoever unless he has on his person his current game licence;
  - (g) take or have in his possession more than the bag limit of game birds allowed pursuant to the Act and these regulations for that day in that place;
  - (h) operate or use or park any vehicle except on a road or track or place set apart or constructed for that purpose;
  - (i) light or cause to be lit or attempt to light a fire, other than a primus or gas stove or similar appliance, except in an authorized place provided for that purpose by or at the order of the Executive Director.
- (6) A person shall not leave or deposit in any game reserve any bottle, can, carton, paper or plastic or other wrapping material or rubbish or litter of any description unless it is left in a receptacle provided for that purpose, and any wildlife officer or honorary wildlife officer may direct any person to recover and remove any such rubbish which the wildlife officer or honorary wildlife officer, on reasonable grounds, believes has been brought into or deposited in such game reserve by such person or by any member of a party of which that person was also a member.

(7) A wildlife officer may orally or in writing direct any person to leave any game reserve at or by or for any time or period of time if he considers it is desirable for the proper management or control of the reserve or for the protection or conservation of fauna and it shall be an offence for any such person so directed to fail or refuse to leave the game reserve later than so directed or to reenter it earlier than so directed.



### DUCK SHOOTING IN THE NORTH

Open Season - Dates and Locations

An open season for wild ducks applies throughout the year in those parts of Western Australia which are outside the South West and Eucla Land Divisions (see map on page 1).

Duck shooting in the North West and Eastern Divisions is not regulated by a shooting season because of the sporadic nature of the rainfall in these areas. In the Kimberley Division, waterfowl usually breed in the wet season (November to February) and the inaccessibility of breeding areas in the wet season restricts most shooters from taking young birds.

Night Shooting

Shooting is prohibited between the hours of sunset and sunrise each day.

### All Other Species Are Protected

Bag Limit

No person may take more than a total of ten ducks per day of the game species listed above.

Possession Limit

On the first day of the open season (January 1):
After the first day of the open season:

ten ducks twenty ducks

### NOTE

- No person may possess or transport a duck unless at least one fully-feathered wing is attached to the bird and that wing and plumage may only be removed from the duck when:
  - (a) the bird is prepared for immediate cooking; or
  - (b) after the bird is taken to the residence of its owner for preservation.
- Bag limits may not be pooled.

### General

In the North West, Kimberley and Eastern Land Divisions, the provisions relating to licences, methods of capture and other restrictions are the same as those applying in the South West and Eucla Land Divisions (see pages 1 and 2).

### CLOSED AREAS

Shooting is prohibited in ALL Nature Reserves and ALL-National Parks in the North West, Kimberley and Eastern Land Divisions except Reserve No. 7634 in the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder (Lakes Carnage, Muddy and Clear).

Duck shooting is also prohibited in all other areas where shooting is prohibited under the provisions of any Act, regulation or by-law.

Particular attention is drawn to the following closed areas which are important waterfowl refuges:

- (a) Lake Argyle and Lake Kununurra and all land within 1.6 kilometres of their shores.
- (b) The Nature Reserves in the vicinity of Wyndham shown on the map on page 20, i.e. Reserves 31967, 1058, 1059, 31636 and 30866.
