

# ROADSIDE CONSERVATION COMMITTEE

## Certificate of Merit



The Roadside Conservation Committee was formed in 1985 in response to concern expressed by local communities, the tourism industry and the conservation movement over the deterioration of roadside vegetation.

The Roadside Certificate of Merit is awarded for projects which demonstrate sympathetic treatment, management or restoration of vegetation within the road or railside environment.

#### CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

The Certificate of Merit is open to all residents, Local Governments and Government Departments of Western Australia.

Projects for the Certificate of Merit should have been established at least two years prior to submission of project.

The judging panel shall consist of a panel of three persons nominated by the Roadside Conservation Committee.

A framed Certificate of Merit and a cash prize of \$250 will be awarded to each category.

Joint winners may be selected if in the opinion of the judges they are of equal merit.


A highly commended Certificate may be awarded if considered worthy by the judges.

The judges reserve the right to not make an award if no entry is of sufficient merit.

The judges decision is final. No correspondence will be entered into.

Nominations are to be made on the form provided.

Closing date for entries is 23/7/93.



#### **CATEGORIES**

#### 1.0 LOCAL GOVERNMENT

Projects in this category would be on road reserves under the care and management of local government authorities. This category is open to councils, private individuals or community groups.

#### 2.0 GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS

This category is for projects carried out on road reserves under the care and maintenance of Main Roads WA or a government department.

#### CRITERIA

All projects should demonstrate sympathetic treatment, management, preservation or restoration of the roadside environment.

Project is defined in its broadest sense and may include any section of road or roadside where as a matter of policy, no action has been taken.

Protection or restoration of the roadside environment:

- protection of existing endemic vegetation, use of endemic vegetation in rehabilitation protection of habitat for endemic fauna and avifauna.
- preservation of areas of special scientific or biological interest.
- environmentally appropriate treatment of water courses, cut faces, batter slopes and contouring works.

Integration of natural elements in the design:

- use of existing plants in landscape plans conformity of design to natural land form including balance between cut and fill.
- effect of alignment and profile of road upon the landscape in general.
