3. SHRUBS.

- Cassia species Shrubs from 1m. to 3m., all bushy with yellow flowers, hardy, and quick growing, 5 different species.
- Acacia species Wattles, all Northern Native Shrubs from 2m. to 4m., drought resistant, lemon, white and yellow flowering, 15 different species.
- Callistemon viminalis Weeping Bottlebrush to 5m. best kept as a shrub.
- Gossypium species Hibiscus family to 2m. with mauve flowers.
- Leucaena cunninghamii A C.S.I.R.O. variety, hardy, fodder tree to 4m.
- Templetonia hookerii Yellow flowered shrub to 2m.

4. CLIMBERS and GROUND COVERS.

- Ipomea braziliensis Used as a Ground Cover or Climber, mauve flowers.
- Bougainvillea varieties Extremely hardy with dense cover.
- Native species (as seed supply and material comes to hand, quantities vary from season to season).

5. FRUITING TREES and SHRUBS.

- Anacardium occidentale Cashew Nut tree. Ornamental tree with an edible vitamin filled apple, the nut is toxic until treated, hardy salt tolerant to 12m.
- Annona muricata Sour Sop Tree to 9m. requires adequate moisture.
- Citrus aurantifolia West Indian Lime to 7m. high in Vitamin C.
- Fortunella japonica Kalamansi Cumquat to 12m. very hardy.
- Psidium guajava Guava a Shrub to 6m. hardy, high in Vitamin C.
- Spondias cythera Golden Apple to 15m. \$3.00 ea.
- Tamarindus indica A tree to 25m. with edible fruits, termite resistant.
- Zizyphus mauritiana Indian Date, excellent drought tolerant tree to 10m.
- Mangifera indica Mango tree to 25m. with 8m. spread, very hardy, seedling and grafted varieties. Priority given to Govt. Dept. Shires and Aboriginal Communities. (Order well in advance).
