



Animal Encounters



Come face to face with some of WA's marsupials. An expert wildlife carer will present a collection of orphaned animals and their life stories. You'll hear how they are raised and prepared for release into the wild when they are older. Depending on availability, you might meet a cheeky quokka, a cute-as-boots bandicoot, a woylie who can carry his shopping in his tail and of course a variety of button-eyed joeys. You'll learn heaps about these special Australians and the features that make them so unique. We keep numbers low in this session to allow you more one-on-one time with each animal.

2 Talking Talons

Spend an hour with the coolest birds of all - our fantastic birds of prey. Listen to their amazing life stories and how they were rescued from the brink of death. Learn about the special skills and features they have which make them efficient hunters of the sky. You'll meet Hobbes the Wedge-tailed eagle, fluffy Scruffy the Barking Owl and Mirage the Peregrine Falcon. If you're lucky, one might sit on your arm and give you that cold predator stare.

3 Smiling Snakes

Meet a range of beautiful snakes and their scaly associates. Hear about their ways of life and the myths that surround them. Don't be scared, be prepared, when next you go bushwalking. Learn to recognise the venomous snakes and how to give first aid for snakebite. If you're lucky, one might curl its tail around your little finger! This is a fantastic snake display accompanied by an informative talk. The venomous snakes are behind glass, but are very much alive.

Wriggly Reptiles

Get up close (in absolute safety) to some of the most venomous snakes in WA. Say Gidday to some special skinks and lizards and find out why Bert the bearded dragon never has a shave. You'll hear some fantastic snaky stories as you meet the stars of this demonstration and information session, Ruby the carpet python and Mr Shivers the Stimson's python who'll do the arm wrestling bit with your expert guide and snake handler.


5 Birds of a Feather

Take a stroll with a 'birdo' (bird watcher) and learn some basics about our wonderful wetland birds. This is a lakeside stroll designed to help bird watching novices look for distinguishing features of birds that help to group them and make quick identification easier. You'll learn how to tell a pigeon from a bird of prey, a wader from a waddler and a cormorant from a coot. You'll get to know most of the birds from their bills, beaks and feet, but also from their habits and habitats. Bring, beg or borrow a pair of binoculars and join us for this 'first steps in birdwatching' session.

6 Our Feathered Friends

Learn the fine art of birdwatching from a local guide and bird identification expert. You'll spy some of our most secretive bush birds, while learning some clever tricks of the birdwatching game. Through a series of activities you'll learn about correct use of binoculars and how to distinguish the different bird forms and their behaviours. A short sketching session highlights the main features of the birds to look for when birdwatching, while a session in bird call identification helps you tell which birds are around even if you can't see them.



Frogs and Bogs

It's raining, it's pouring, staying home is boring! Join in on these special frogging sessions. Sneak into some of Perth's most mysterious 'bogs' (swamps wetlands, etc) and visit the land of frogs. A local 'frogger' (frog watcher) guides you through a series of fun activities and a special 'frog search' that helps build on your knowledge about frogs, the environmental issues that effect them and how you can safely 'frogwatch' on your own.

8 Polywogs in Pools

This is educational water play for all ages. Join a local naturalist for a look under the lake's surface. You'll scoop net and catch some of the many different 'swamp dwellers' (small invertebrates that live in or near the lakes and swamps). All water life is handled carefully and returned back to the water after a short stay in special viewing trays. You'll be amazed at the science-fiction like creatures that come out of the swamps.

9 Find the Forest Frogs

Don your old boots and help search for our forest frogs that live deep in the Perth Hills. Join in on a frog search and how to identify the more commonly seen frogs around the area. Be prepared to get your hands dirty and have fun as you go 'knee deep' to locate these mysterious and beautiful amphibians.

W Kids Go Frogging

Hey kids! We've got a couple of special Kids Go Frogging sessions where you'll be taken to the very edge of the watery world of frogs. You'll learn how to be a good frog watcher and make your own frog badges to take home. First you'll meet a real live backyard favourite - the Motorbike frog. Then learn some fantastic frog calls and basic frog identification techniques. Finally join in on a special Hills Go Frogging session (frog search) and practise your frog watching skills. This is a session especially for kids. We'll provide a cuppa for parents or supervising adults who must stay on site.

Bush Babies and Cuddly Critters

Hear about their life stories and how they got into the Kooikuna Fauna Centre to be raised by hand and later released back into the wild. This session is designed for the little ones and aims to make them more aware of our special native animals and their needs.

Snugglegum and Cuddlenut



There is a reasonably steep climb back up from the waterfall (approx 1km) and it is recommended that patrons have a reasonable to good level of fitness.

BBoomerangs and Bush Tucker

You'll learn about traditional hunting methods and try your hand at spear and boomerang throwing. Finish this great session by painting a souvenir boomerang to take home with you.
