- WA's only specialist wood working school where you can meet designer/makers at work
- displays and exhibits which bring the forest to life
- a gallery featuring fine wood pieces made by WA's talented designer/makers

Outside, you can walk among the tops of trees on the forest canopy walk, wander along magical forest trails, or explore a traditional Aboriginal mia mia and early timber getter's hut.

The Forest Heritage Centre is open seven days from 10am to 5pm

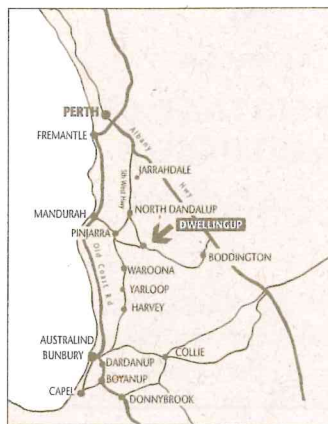

MAKE A DAY OF IT IN DWELLINGUP

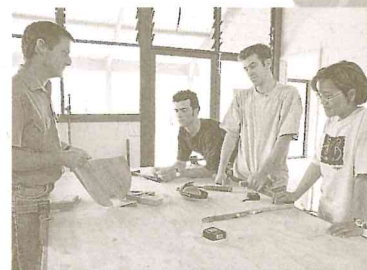
Dwellingup is an historic timber town located in the heart of timber country. Burnt to the ground in 1961 by devastating bushfires, the town has been rebuilt to regain its original charm.

Local attractions include North and South Dandalup dams, the Murray River—great for canoeing, Lane Poole Reserve—one of the State's most popular picnic and camping spots, WA's only prisoner-of-war camp site, and the Hotham Valley Railway which operates forest tours from Dwellingup.

The area abounds in walk and drive trails. The Dwellingup History and Visitor Information Centre is an excellent place to start.

We can arrange special activities for groups of all sizes. Our forest guides can take you to a nearby working timber mill, or stoke up the fire as you enjoy billy tea and damper in the open air.



WAKE UP IN THE JARRAH FOREST

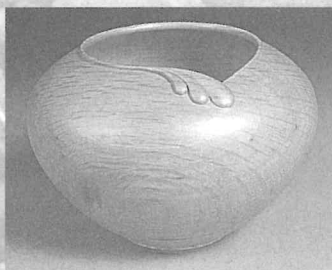
