

- Meals and refreshments are available at the Yanchep Inn and Chawn Mia Tea Rooms.
- Scheduled activities commence at 8am daily with discounts for concession and group bookings. Park entry fees apply.
- Advance group bookings can be made by phoning the park office during business hours or at the visitor centre on arrival.

Office hours are 8am – 5pm every day of the year.




Natural & Cultural Meeting Place
