Take action on litter in and around our oceans and rivers.



## WHEN YOU ARE FISHING

- Leave no litter, dispose of rubbish thoughtfully; use a bin or take it home.
- Avoid disposables, pack food in reusable containers and buy products without plastic wrapping.

#### ON THE BOAT

 Stow your rubbish where it can't be washed or blown away and bring all waste and litter back to shore to dispose of properly.

### IF YOU SMOKE

 Bin your butt, cigarette filters are made of plastic; put your butts in a personal ashtray or bin and never into the water.

#### AT HOME AND OUT AND ABOUT

- Dispose of wastes properly, never allow toxic chemicals like paint, fertilisers, pesticides and oils to enter the stormwater system (your council can assist you with correct disposal).
- Carry a litter-bag if you walk at the beach, every piece of litter you pick up is one less that can cause harm.
- Get your dog involved, dog droppings may impact on water quality if washed into waterways; use a scoop bag and dispose of properly.
- Never drop litter in the streets or from a vehicle always use a bin or keep a litter bag in your vehicle.
