




Indigenous Cadetship Support

Are you an undergraduate student of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent enrolled in full-time study in a diploma (or higher) qualification? Want to jumpstart your career with work experience and pathways into employment? Ever dreamt of making a difference to WA's environment?



The Western Australian Department of Environment and Conservation (DEC), in partnership with the Federal Department of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations, is providing financial support and work experience to Indigenous students while they're studying.

Indigenous Cadetship Support (ICS) is an Australian Government initiative that improves the professional employment prospects of Indigenous Australians. It links Indigenous tertiary students with employers in a cadetship arrangement involving full-time study and work placements.




Cadets are supported with:

- a study allowance for up to 40 weeks each academic year and a book subsidy each semester
- paid work placements during semester breaks
- support from DEC training staff and workplace supervisors
- a corporate wardrobe
- annual national park personnel entry pass
- the opportunity to apply for the DEC Graduate Development Program or full-time employment on successful completion of their relevant studies.

You can apply for a cadetship any time during your studies. Cadets are chosen from a range of disciplines, including:

- environmental sciences
- sustainability
- biological sciences
- natural resource management
- public policy and management
- human resources
- health sciences.
