## THE JARRAH FOREST LODGE



The Jarrah Forest Lodge has all the features you would expect in a timber town, wooden floors and wood fires. Accommodation is simple, but clean and comfortable. Rooms open to wide verandahs. An open gazebo and wood barbecue enhance the atmosphere. Sixteen heated, single, twin or bunk bedrooms are available (you need to bring your own bedding). Cooking and bathroom facilities are shared.

The Lodge is a great place for groups to get away from it all, or for a conference on a budget.
Full conference facilities for up to thirty people is available.

A range of educational and forest-based guided tours are available by appointment. Special event programs can also be arranged.





The Forest Heritage Centre, located a comfortable ninety-minute drive south-east of Perth, is nestled in the historic jarrah forest of Dwellingup.



A unique leaf-shaped building made of rammed earth, the Forest Heritage Centre provides the visitor with an increased awareness of the jarrah forest through its interpretive displays, extensive forest trails, including an Aboriginal trail, timber getter's hut walk and a viewing platform reaching 11 metres into the jarrah canopy.

## THE SCHOOL OF WOOD

The Forest Heritage Centre also houses
the School of Wood, Western Australia's only specialist
wood training facility, and is proud of its facilities in
providing a centre of excellence for the fine wood industry.
Students participate in a wide range of courses, like the
two-year, full-time Diploma of Art - Furniture Design course.
Visitors to the Centre have an opportunity to meet students
at work, or participate in an extensive range of Creative
Workshops. These workshops, inspired by the jarrah forest,
are based on a timber theme and are usually conducted
on weekends.
