

A Special Place

Heritage listed Golden Valley Tree Park contains an interesting collection of trees from all over the planet and is the State's largest arboretum; part landscaped park in the "English" tradition, part series of Australian panoramas and part dense conifer forest.

It is a place of many moods, changes in the season, changes in the weather, with different things to see every time you visit.

Located at the entrance to the Park the restored Golden Valley Homestead (c.1890) is gatehouse to a beautiful valley that has been progressively landscaped for over a century. The stories of its people and pasts are set out on the walktracks.



For all Seasons

Autumn chill turns the World Collection into a moving feast of deciduous autumn colours from late March through to May and even later. In Winter and early spring frosts and morning mists shroud the landscape in mystery, until the sun comes out highlighting the feast of yellow wattles flowering against blue skies and green hills of the Australian Collection. Then comes the procession of the Spring flush as the exotic trees unfurl their soft pastel foliage and flowers and all is lush. In full Summer check out the resilience of eucalypts flowering in defiance of the heat or simply enjoy a picnic under the shady oaks.

Golden Valley Tree Park lies just south of Balingup and is clearly signposted from Southwest Highway.

Alternative access is by an easy 2km walk along the Bibbulmun Track southwards from the town

Whilst there is no charge for entry a donation in the boxes provided at information shelters will help the work of our volunteers.

The Park is open every day. Camping is not permitted. Your dog is welcome on a leash.

There are toilets, gas barbecues, picnic tables and a gazebo shelter.


Walktracks lead from the car parks to points of interest but feel free to wander on your own journey of discovery.
