



Experience the bush on a bicycle

The Munda Biddi Trail (which means path through the forest in the Nyoongar Aboriginal language) is the latest addition to Western Australia's growing set of world-class recreational trails. Vast areas of majestic eucalypt forests, rolling hills, and year-round cycling weather make Western Australia the ideal setting for a long distance off-road cycle trail.



Starting in Mundaring in the hills east of Perth, the trail meanders through scenic river valleys and the magnificent eucalypt forests of Western Australia's South West.





Something for everyone



The Munda Biddi Trail has been designed for cyclists of all ages and experience levels. Enjoy a peaceful morning ride or challenge yourself to a week-long wilderness adventure. Many vehicle access points allow you to design your own journey.


The Trail uses a network of bush tracks, firebreaks and disused railway formations, so most of your trip will be on gentle grades except where you enter and exit the scenic river valleys.

If you're keen on an extended off-road adventure, you can camp in purpose-built Munda Biddi campsites. Situated a comfortable day's ride apart, the camps have roomy sleeping shelters and tent sites. Or if a hot shower and a comfortable bed tempt you at the end of your ride, the Trail passes through a



town at least every second day, ensuring easy re-supply and a range of accommodation choices.

Cycle through nature




Further south, the Trail will pass through towering karri and tingle forests before it ends in the coastal town of Albany on the dramatic

Southern Ocean. Relax and enjoy the scenery while you cycle through nature.
