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Rare flora Morawa area

These rare species are found in very small numbers at only a few locations. They are threatened by land clearing, drought, weed invasion and grazing.

Habitat Tall shrubland or woodland **Description** A shrub one to 2.5 metres tall Flowering time July to October

(Verticordia spicata subsp. squamosa)



Habitat Tall shrubland on sandplains **Description** A shrub to one metre tall Flowering time November to December

Mingenew everlasting

(Schoenia filifolia subsp. subulifolia)

Silky eremophila

(Eremophila nivea)



Habitat Open York gum woodland and open scrub, usually near the edge of seasonal creeks **Description** A shrub one to two metres tall Flowering time August to October

Jingymia mallee

(Eucalyptus synandra)



Habitat Undulating or flat country with heath and scrub on sand and sandy loam

Description A mallee tree 3.5 to 10 metres tall Flowering time December to March

Habitat Swampy flats and crabholes **Description** A herb to 50 centimetres tall Flowering time September to October
