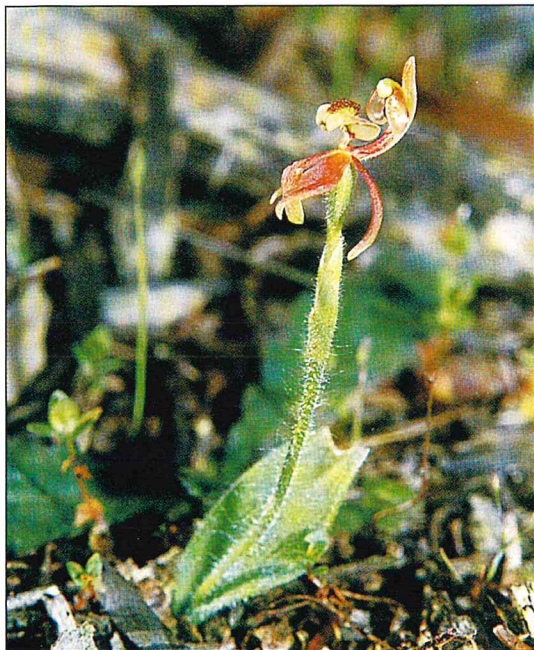

This is one of the smallest and rarest Western Australian orchids.
It is only 5-10 cm tall. The leaf is 4-6 cm long and 75mm wide.
The flowers are only 1-2 cm in diameter ranging from green to
apricot in colour. They flower from August to early October.

CALM is working with the community to conserve the Dwarf Spider Orchid
on private property and public owned land, including road reserves.
CALM can help private property owners to look after this species, if it
occurs on their property.
