This small spreading shrub grows to just over 1m tall and 1.5m across and has an attractive layered appearance. Its leaves have 3 to 6 lobes each of which are divided into 3 lobes. Large red flowers are borne at the ends of its branchlets which usually bend downwards. It flowers from August to September.

CALM is working with the community to conserve Maxwell's grevillea on private property and public owned land, including road reserves. CALM can help private property owners to look after this species, if it occurs on their property.
