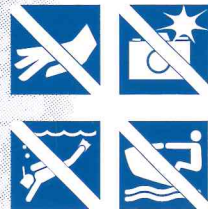
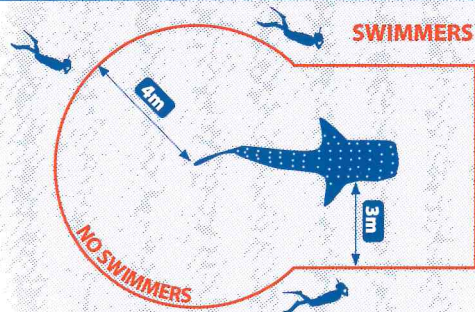
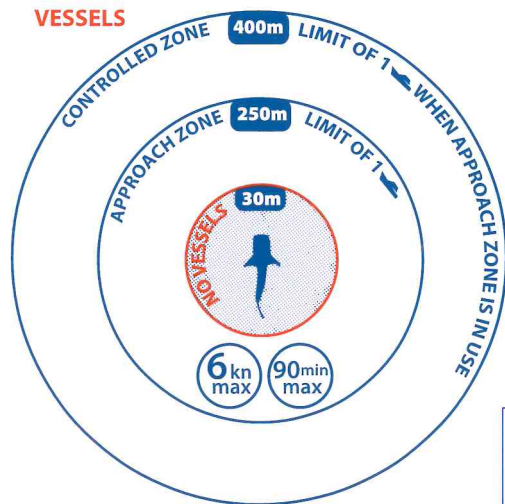

KNOW YOUR ZONES

Be courteous to others, know the rules, and wait your turn.

GO SLOW

Reduce your speed and maintain a lookout.

TAKE CARE AND KEEP CLEAR if you see these flags displayed, as tour guests may be swimming with a whale shark.



Touching, disturbing, interfering with the natural movement of, or breaching separation distances for whale sharks in Western Australia is prohibited under the *Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016*. Penalties of up to \$500,000 may apply.
