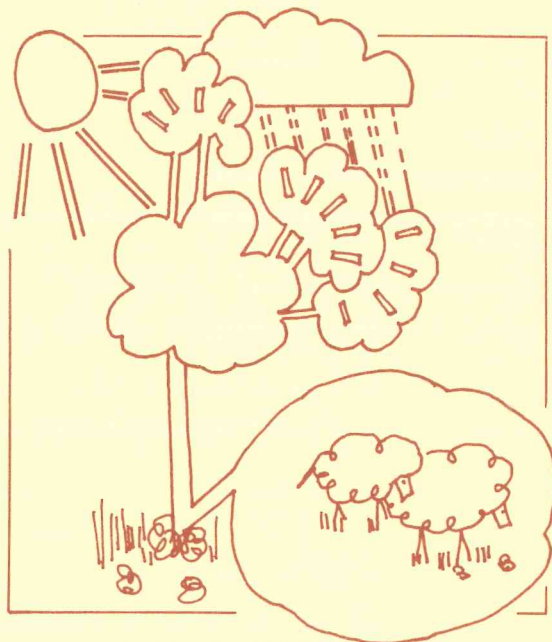

Distribution Season: 1st May to 31st August

Conditions of Sale

1. The distribution season commences 1st May and closes on 31st August (pines 31 July).
2. Plants are sold on the understanding that they are not to be offered for resale.
3. No trees will be despatched to applicants for planting within the city or suburban areas or to any destination outside Western Australia.
4. Where possible, orders will be grouped in customer lots and delivered to Shire offices or other locations by arrangement.
5. Substitutes will be made for trees not available at time of despatch unless the order is clearly marked otherwise.
6. The nursery reserves the right to supply a lesser number of trees than were ordered when the accompanying remittance is insufficient to cover the full value of the order.
7. A remittance made payable to the Forests Department must accompany each order for trees. Postage stamps will not be accepted.
8. Orders of less than 10 pots will not be delivered.

Advice to Clients

1. Clients requiring large numbers of trees are requested to place order by 30 September of the year prior to planting to enable adequate stocks to be produced.
2. Clients are requested to use the order form supplied with the price list when such is available.
