
Perth's Regional Parks

Perth's open space system includes land reserved in eight regional parks, ranging in location from Joondalup to the north, Rockingham in the south, and Darling Range to the east (see map below). From the variation in locations there is a wide variety of geological features, vegetation types, areas of interest and social settings.

The Department of Conservation and Land Management has been responsible for co-ordinating the protection and enhancement of the parks conservation, recreation and landscape values since 1997. These urban parks are used daily for sport, leisure activities, social gatherings and nature study.

The regional parks provide a perfect opportunity for participants of the Go Bush program to become familiar with the parks by taking part in activities close to where they live, or to explore parks within the metropolitan area further from home.

Each of the parks is managed according to a Management Plan that is developed and implemented in conjunction with community groups and local government. For additional information on Regional Parks please call 9431 6500.
