
Intriguing on the outside. Just plain fascinating on the inside.

There's plenty to see and do in and around the Forest Heritage Centre:


- Walk through the tree tops of the jarrah forest yes, really!

The Forest Heritage Centre, Acacia Street, Dwellingup, is nestled in high-quality jarrah forest, 90 minutes from Perth or Bunbury and 30 minutes from Mandurah.



Make a day of it at Dwellingup!

Dwellingup is a forest town, planted right in the heart of fine jarrah forest. At the turn of the century it was a thriving timber centre. Then, in 1961, it was literally burnt to the ground by bushfires sparked by an incredible 26 lightning strikes.

Now rebuilt, Dwellingup is the home of 350 or so residents. Most of them live and work in the forest, maintaining the town's ties with the beautiful jarrah that surrounds it. The natural attractions of the forest are in complete harmony with the unchanged atmosphere of this bush town and its close-knit community.

Natural highlights close by

- North and South Dandalup dams offer breathtaking views and serviced picnic areas. Dwellingup is in the forested water catchment network and supplies fresh water to the people of the south-west.
- The Lane Poole Reserve along the Murray River has many special picnic and camping areas all focussed on this scenic river.
- The Marrinup forest tour links the Marrinup Falls walktrail, the Prisoner of War Camp, and the Oakley Dam picnic site right on the edge of the Darling Scarp.
