COASTAL PLAIN WALK TRAIL

GET ready to step out and explore CALM's most recent walk trail just north of Perth.

Whether it's a day walk, a weekend ramble or a three-day hike you're after, be sure to include this trail on your 1997 'outdoors calendar'.

Situated between the forested hills of the Darling Scarp and the coast, the trail stretches along almost 70km of Perth's northwestern corridor from Yanchep National Park to Melaleuca Conservation Park. The trail has been purpose-built to capture the distinct sights, sounds and scents of our Swan Coastal Plain – taking in tranquil wetlands, coastal heath, banksia-jarrah woodland and



majestic pockets of tuart forest. In early spring and summer, the trees, shrubs and heathlands display their presence with a profusion of flowers such as the Morrison featherflower and coastal smokebush.

The trail includes many other features for walkers, such as backpacker shelters, rain water supplies, fire rings and rustic bush toilets. The trail is easily accessible by public transport and within 30 minutes of Perth city.

Trail guides can be purchased from CALM metropolitan offices from June 1997.

The second section of the trail will be extended from Neaves Road to Walyunga National Park and will be open to walkers from Spring 1997.
