Jewel Cave


The lofty halls of The Jewel Cave and its underground wilderness are a sight to behold. Discovered in 1957 and opened for inspection in 1959 the cave is home to the largest straw stalactite to be found in any tourist cave. Fossil remains 25,000 years old have been found.

Moondyne Cave



Mammoth Cave


Revealing prehistoric fauna from over 35,000 years Mammoth cave provides easy viewing and a chance to view fossil remains of the now extinct zygomaturus trilobus, a wombat like creature. Mammoth was first recorded in 1850 and explored later in 1895.
