ADVICE TO AUTHORS

Conservation Science Western Australia publishes scientific research and technical investigations carried out by the Department of Conservation and Land Management. All papers are refereed by scientists outside the Department.

Address editorial correspondence and submissions to The Editor, *Conservation Science Western Australia*, Science Division, Department of Conservation and Land Management, Locked Bag 104, Bentley Delivery Centre, Western Australia 6983.

Include a completed *Approval Form for Scientific and Technical Publications* with all scientific and technical manuscripts submitted.

Only papers of a high standard will be published. Submission of a paper implies that the material has not been published or submitted elsewhere. The journal assumes that all authors of a multi-authored paper agree to its submission and accept intellectual responsibility for it.

Initially forward **three** hard copies of the manuscript and all accompanying material to the Editor. Manuscripts received will be submitted to two referees for critical comment. If both referees consulted agree on whether the manuscript is acceptable or unacceptable this will be passed on to the senior author. If the referees disagree a third referee will be sought. If there is still doubt the Science Publications Committee will decide on the matter.

Print manuscripts on one side of the paper with double spacing and 3 cm margins. Number the pages of the manuscript consecutively throughout the entire paper, beginning at the title page, and including those pages containing references, appendices, tables, illustrations, captions, all of which are placed after the text.

Following refereeing, the authors must return a revised manuscript with disc copies of all material within six months, otherwise it will be rejected or treated as a newly submitted manuscript requiring refereeing.

The editor may amend the text of a contribution in order to make it more generally comprehensible.

Manuscripts that do not meet submission requirements will be returned to the author.

Because the journal is freely available on the Internet, no reprints are available for authors.

Style

Authors are advised to consult the most recent journal issue published for directions on style; however, specific points to note are as follows.

Spelling conforms with the Oxford English Dictionary. However, use 'program' and 'focused'. Use also -ize endings (with the exception of 'compromise' or 'comprise'), -lyse endings and -our (unless in Latin words).

SI units are used for exact physical quantities and measurements.

Numbers referring to unit measurement (e.g. 10 cm) are never spelt out unless forming the beginning of a sentence. All numbers under 10 not referring to units of measurement are spelt out.

Identify **abbreviations** the first time they are used.

Cite **references** in full using the Harvard system (name and year in text, alphabetical listing).

Examples of correct format for the **reference list** are:

Abbott, I. (1980a). The floras of 37 south-western Australian islands. *Western Australian Herbarium Research Notes* **3**, 19-36.

Brown, A., Thomson-Dans, C. and Marchant, N. (1998). *Western Australia's Threatened Flora*. Department of Conservation and Land Management, Como.

Villiers, T. A. (1972). Seed dormancy. In *Seed Biology: Volume 2* (ed. T. T. Kozlowski), pp. 219-281. Academic Press, New York.

Accuracy of the references is the responsibility of authors.

Personal communications - use a footnote to refer to these, with the affiliation and location of the person noted. In the text use the words 'personal communication' not 'pers. comm.'.

Illustrations, figures or maps - when these are computer-generated ensure that the density of any tints is not less than 30%, and that there is a significant difference between varying tints. Use the abbreviation, 'Fig.' for all references to figures in text.

ABSTRACT

This bibliography, based on an electronic database of material authored by state government department staff since 1896, contains 9138 items on the flora, fauna and forests of Western Australia. An extensive search of staff lists, publications and library catalogues was undertaken to build a comprehensive database and as a result the bibliography provides a history of government research. Only 28 items were produced pre 1920, with 405 produced in the 1920s. After a decline during the 1930s and 1940s, the number of titles has steadily increased to 5122 titles produced in the 1990s.

INTRODUCTION

This is a bibliography of publications and materials by staff of the Forests Department (1896–1984), the Departments of Fisheries, Fisheries and Fauna and Fisheries and Wildlife (1898–1984), the State Gardens Board (1920–1956), the National Parks Board and Authority (1956–1984), the Government Botanist and forest entomologists of the Department of Agriculture (1897–1928), the State and Western Australian Herbarium (1921–1988) and the Department of Conservation and Land Management's Research Division (RD), Science and Information Division (SID), CALMScience Division (CSD) and Science Division (SD) (1985–2001). Journal articles, books, unpublished reports, abstracts, 16 mm films, videos, slides, CDROMs and ephemeral items such as posters, pamphlets and wall charts have all been included.

This bibliography includes papers and reports about Western Australian flora and fauna by staff of the Department of Conservation and Land Management and its predecessors. Papers and reports on topics such as general departmental management, sheep, wheat, commercial marine fisheries and trout have been excluded. Also excluded are papers by staff of other state government

departments and authorities such as the Western Australian Museum. The Perth Observatory joined the Department in 1996 but, as their research is not biological, their publications have not been included.

The bibliography commenced as a divisional bibliography incorporating all papers written by RD/SID/CSD/SD staff from 1985. The main guideline for the database was that the paper had to have been written under the auspices of RD/SID/CSD/SD, so Herbarium staff papers were included after July 1988 when it became part of the Department of Conservation and Land Management. It included items of a non-scientific nature, which were omitted from the extract published in 1998¹. This Inmagic database has been continually maintained, so that an up-to-date listing of papers (including submitted and 'in press' titles) can be extracted or viewed at any time.

The decision to produce a bibliography that covered relevant research on the flora, fauna and forests of Western Australia back to the beginning of responsible government in 1890 meant that the existing bibliographic database would reflect most of the research conducted by employees of the State. It also ensures that early research work is not overlooked and will save time for future researchers.

METHODS

The initial database was started using the Department of Conservation and Land Management Library Catalogue. However, it was realised that the creation of staff lists should have been the first step, therefore a list of pre-1985 staff was extracted from the Public Service List and staff lists appearing in annual reports. The main disadvantage with using the Public Service List is that only salaried officers are included, which has left gaps in a truly comprehensive list of staff. Post-1985 staff were gathered from thirty one sources of staff names, and two spreadsheets compiled with the names and presence of that name within a source document. Once the lists were compiled, the names not already known were checked in the Library Catalogue and any records added to the Divisional Bibliography. Consultants have also been included, if they were funded by a relevant Department at the time.

All the records taken from the Library Catalogue had to be amended to comply with the differences imposed by a bibliographic database. This involved the moving of information around the record and changing the format.

The publication lists in research plans, seminars, internal bibliographies and annual reports were checked against the existing database and papers not there were added. Many publications were also checked for papers that had not been included in the database including journals, conference proceedings, edited publications, departmental newsletters and *CALM News*. A large number of records were added from these various sources.

The references in the post-1985 bibliography were initially classed as being in one of six categories. These categories were expanded to 17, and further expanded to 44, as new requirements for the database were discovered. These categories are used for various purposes, and are still utilised internally for various reports. They also enable the formatting of the records for bibliographic and online purposes.

Once it was decided that the post-1985 database was as complete as possible (2442 records), a list of papers was produced for each author in the database. All staff still with the Department were sent the list with a request to check, amend or add to it as required, to note any authors who had been employed as consultants, and to supply the Library Archives with any papers indicated as

not being held. This procedure was not followed for the pre-1985 references.

As the lists were returned, the bibliography was amended and added to. Further sources were noted, with even more records added from these, and authors were followed up for the return of their lists. As of 25 September 1997 there were 2720 records in the database; however, with the continual updating of the database, the post-1985 titles now number 4903. With an additional 4235 titles from pre-1985, the combined total is 9138 published titles as of 31 December 2001.

Some of the pre-1985 references are sketchy at best. Some have been taken from references at the end of staff papers and full details were often not included. This has therefore resulted in 159 titles that have not been sighted and may actually not exist. Nonetheless these have been included in the hope that they may be located in the future. Often there was no author attributed to a paper so the Department has been cited as the author.

As many of the titles as possible were sighted and reference lists checked. Most of the titles in the bibliography can be found within the collections of the Department of Conservation and Land Management Library.

DISCUSSION

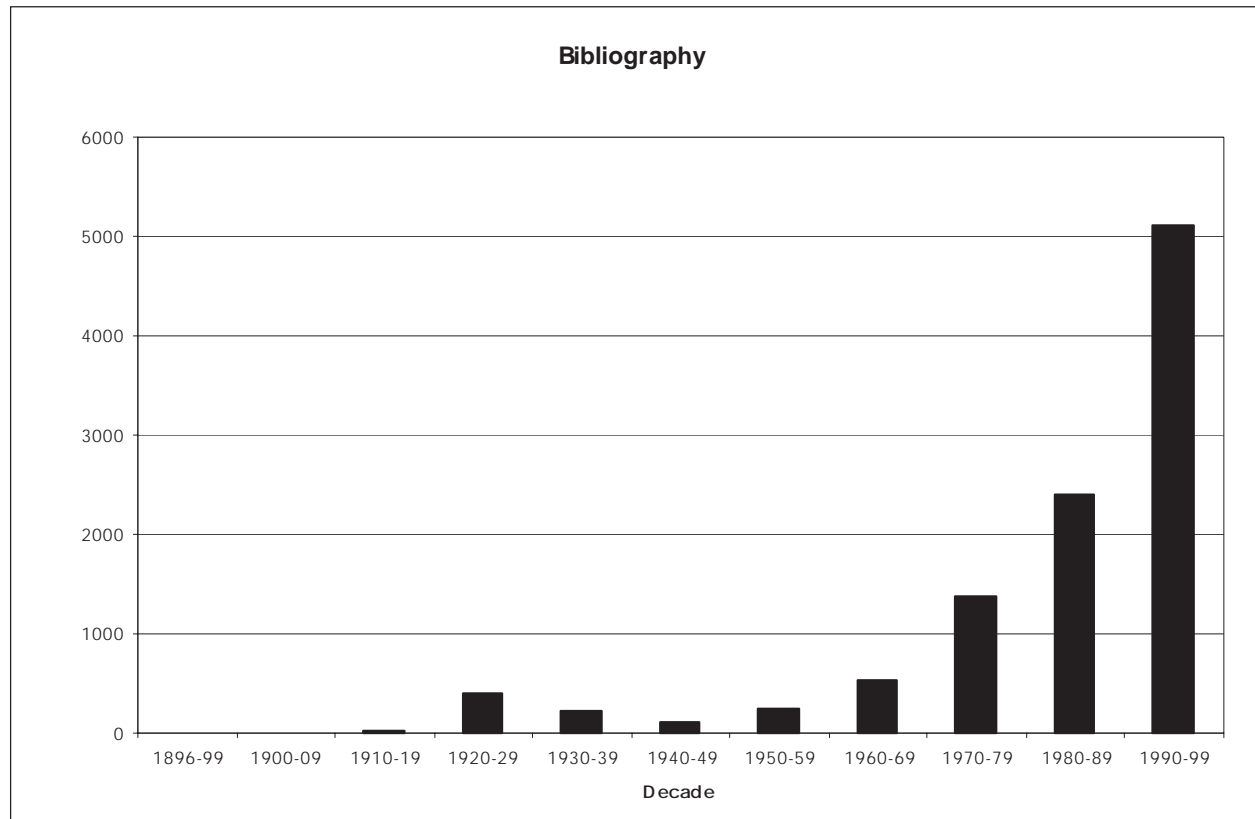


Figure 1. Number of titles produced per decade. The 79 titles without dates and the 2070 titles for 2000–2001 have not been included.

The database enables a view of how Western Australian government research has developed during the last century. Figure 1 opposite shows that though only a small number of publications were produced in the early decades of the twentieth century, the number of publications rapidly increased decade by decade. Only 28 items were produced pre 1920 and 405 produced during the 1920s. After a decline during the 1930s and 1940s, the number of titles steadily increased to 5122 titles for the 1990s.

The project involved the application of library and information management skills in database design and reference searching to establish and develop a representative database. Now that the bibliographic database has been fully established, staff and community members can easily obtain tailored listings of research and gain access to the scientific knowledge base of the Department.
