## **Book now for summer camping in the SW**

Bookings are open for camping at [Logue Brook Dam](#), [Stockton Lake](#) and [Leschenault Peninsula Conservation Park](#) for stays from 1 December.

Stays up to, and including 30 November 2025 remain 'first in best dressed' but, from 1 December 2025, you will need to book before you go.

The good news? Booking with Park Stay WA is easy. You can:

- create a personal account - to make payments and manage your booking including making cancellations
- book up to 180 days in advance
- see availability ahead of time
- even book on the day of arrival (if there's space!)

## Keep an eye out for these signs at the beach

Keep an eye out for these green and red BEN signs when visiting the beach.

Each [Beach Emergency Number](#) sign has a unique code. In an emergency, dial 000, quote the BEN code and stay near the sign if possible. This helps first responders find the location quickly and efficiently.
