# MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES

- Establish cooperative linkage with stakeholders to identify mutual outcomes.
- Develop sets of ecological units based on geographic areas/land systems that exist within and across boundary of LG by July 2005.

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# MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES

- Exclude fire from identified vulnerable assets/species/system over the term of the management plan.
  - E.g. identify areas of Mulga that can be protected through strategic burns and set indicative targets
  - E.g. Planning to protect homestead complex
  - E.g. known sensitive Aboriginal sites
- Burn to meet specific identified needs.
  - E.g. identify areas that require burning for habitat modification/regeneration and set specific targets (?)

# MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES

- For each ecological unit no more than 50% burnt in a single fire wildfire event
- Establish a mosaic of fire based on an idealized “area/ time since burnt” curve for each ecological unit.
