

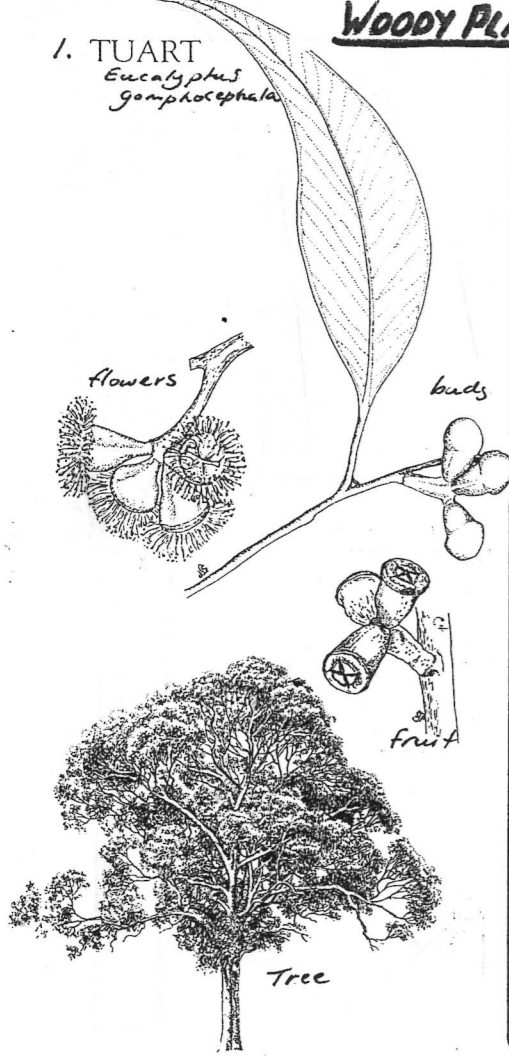
WOODY PLANTS

TREES

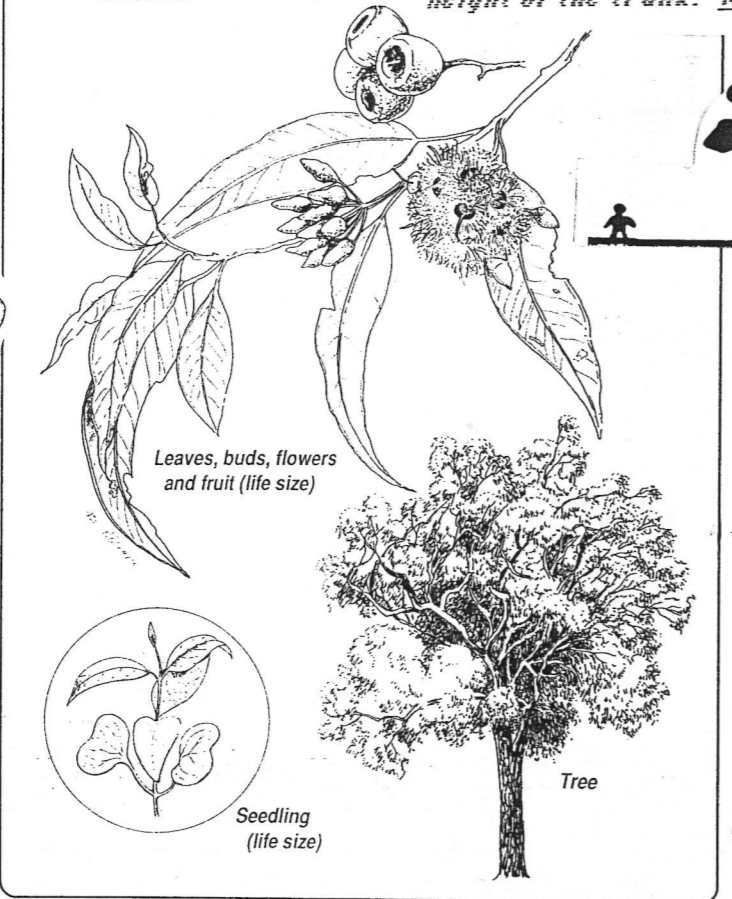
Plants with a trunk and canopy.

The canopy is less than or equal to 2/3 of the height of the trunk. No lignotuber.

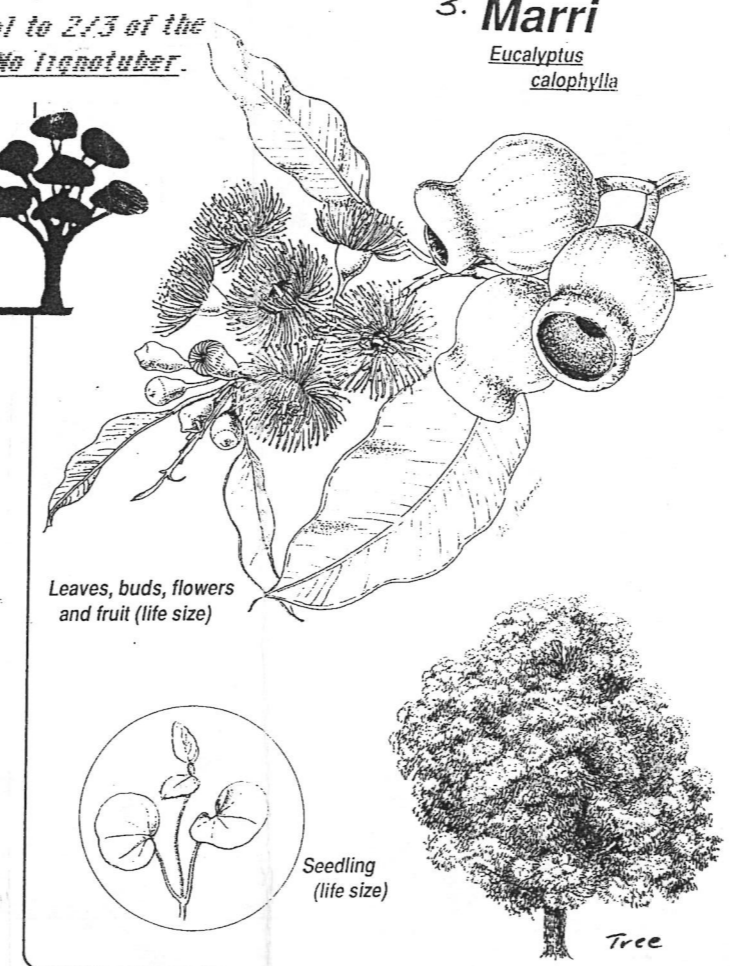

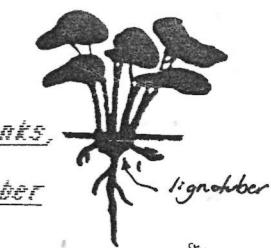


4. FLOODED GUM, moitch
Eucalyptus rudis

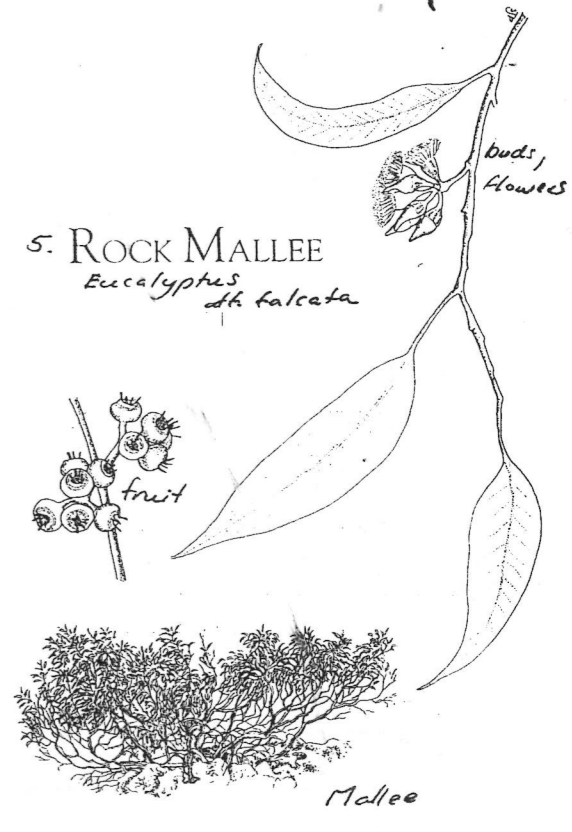


MALLEES

- A plant with many trunks, arising from a lignotuber



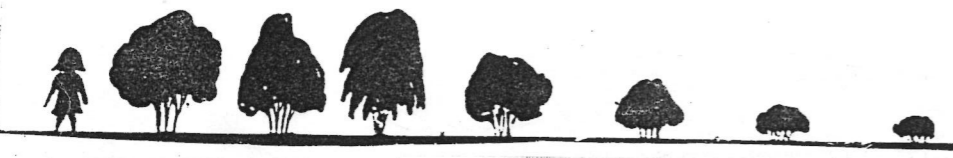
5. ROCK MALLEE

Plants with one or many woody stems.

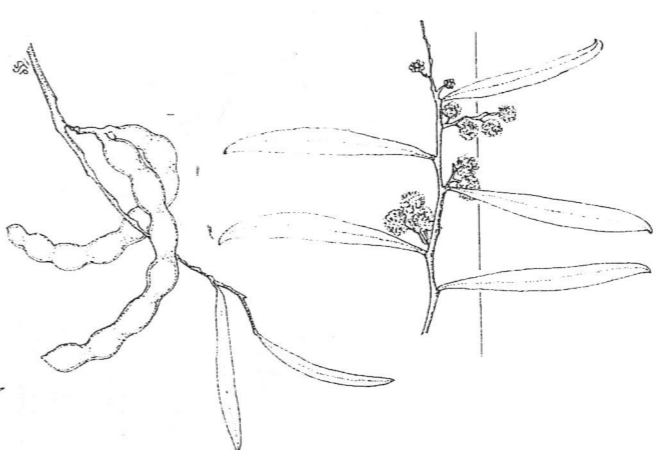
Foliage all or part of the total height of the plant.

Acacia xanthina Shrub



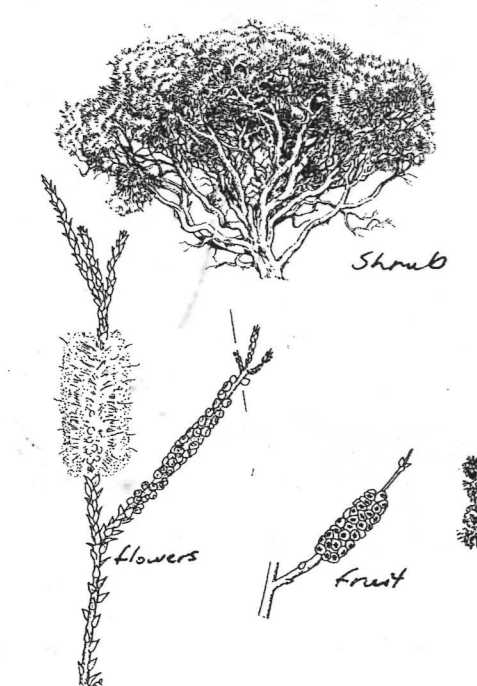
9. SUMMER-SCENTED WATTLE
Acacia rostellifera



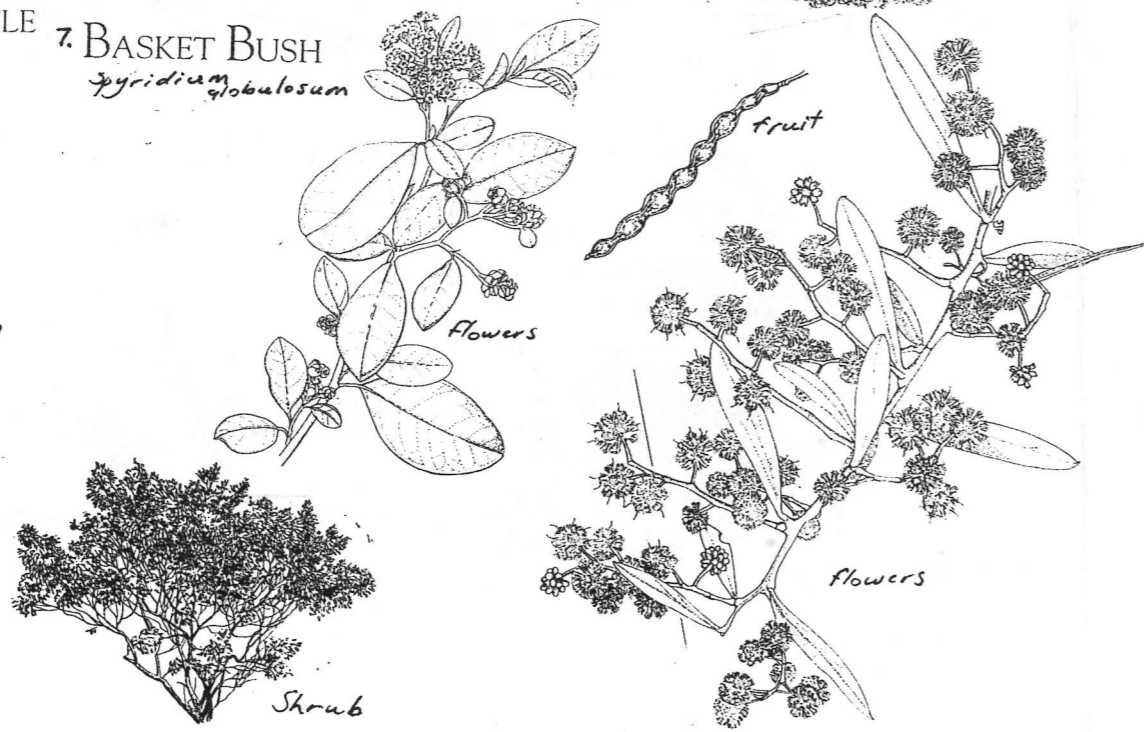
10. PARROTBUSH, ^{kwapak}

Metaleuca huegelii



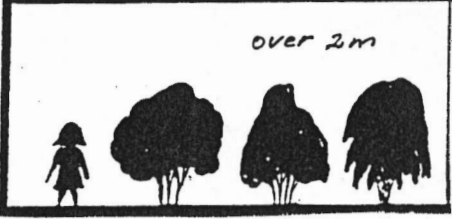
7. BASKET BUSH

SHRUBS woody, multiple stems or short trunk. Foliage all or part of total height plant.

NON-WOODY PLANTS

HERBS
Annual or perennial/ includes creepers and climbers. under .5m (except creepers)

Annual or perennial plants with non-woody stems. Generally under 1/2 metre except for climbers and creepers. Most monocotyledons. Except grasses, palms and grass trees (blackboys). Grass trees are placed with Shrubs, and Palms with Shrubs or Trees



17. Prickly Conostylis
Conostylis aculeata

GRASSES
Poaceae. Erect or spreading. under .5m

Grasses are uncommon in most south-west plant communities but common in the north-west. All have inconspicuous flowers that are pollinated by wind.



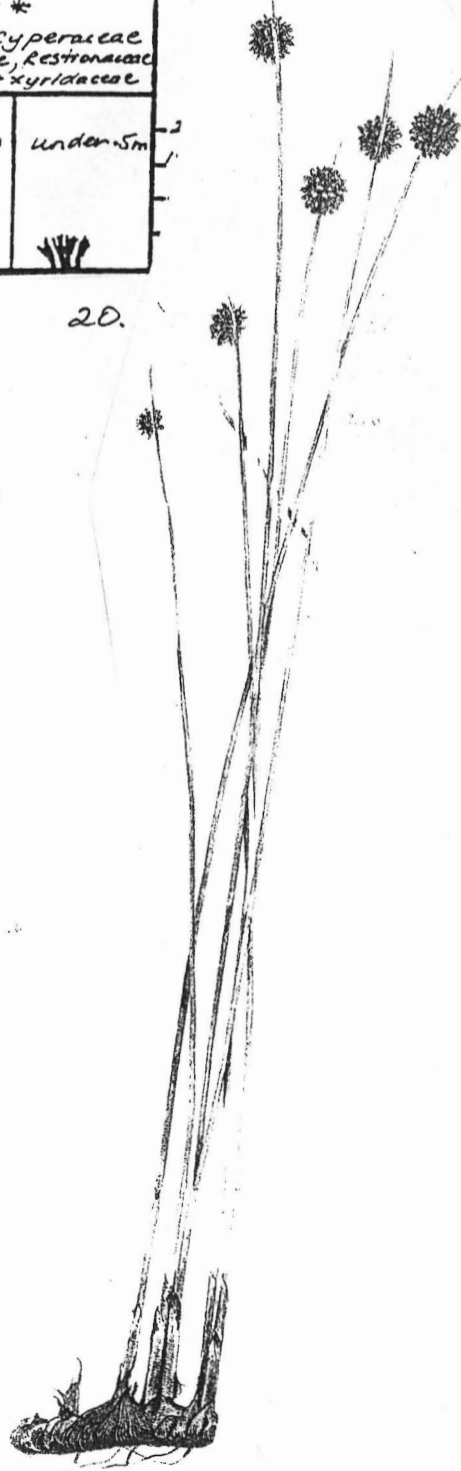

SEDGES*
tufted, Cyperaceae, Juncaceae, Restionaceae, Typhaceae + Xyridaceae

over .5m under .5m

SEDGES or GRASS-LIKE PLANTS
Tufted or spreading plants from the groups Sedges (families Cyperaceae and Restionaceae) and Rushes (family Juncaceae), Bullrushes (family Typhaceae) and Xyridaceae. Many have inconspicuous flowers that are pollinated by wind.
