Off Road Vehicles

Problems

- Areas of high conservation value to us tend to be areas of preference for ORV's
- It is an increasing problem
- There are not sufficient powers for Rangers in enforcement or prosecution of ORV drivers
- People are not walking or riding horses in some areas because of increased numbers of ORV's
- There are potential insurance problems if ORV's are designated an area to use
- DEC will have potential liability problems in the future as a result of ORV use

Solutions

- Registration and licensing of ORV's at the place of purchase
- Third party insurance for ORV's when purchased and an annual registration
- New license requirements similar to that of the skippers ticket for boaters. This should include age restrictions
- Regulations on the safety and design of ORV's to reduce the number of cheap, unsafe imported ORV's.
- Get the media on side to show the damage caused by ORV's dieback spread, erosion, safety issues etc
- Provide somewhere else for ORV's to go
- Local Government coorperation is required in order to formalize a uniform approach
- There should be a waiver on liability for Local Governments when they provide a designated ORV area
- It is time to get tough to stem the number of deaths and injuries, let alone reduce the environmental impacts.
