

Carnaby's Cockatoos on Swan Coastal Plain: Strategic Review

Context

- Increasing conflict between biodiversity outcomes and urban growth.
- Pressures most significant in the case of mobile species (traditional environmental impact assessment has led to perverse outcomes).
- Difficulties in "retrofitting" biodiversity conservation into established urban fabric:
 - Limited opportunities
 - High costs.

The way forward

- Agreement in principle reached at meeting of 12 June 2009 between DEWHA and State Government agencies.
 - "a conservation agreement based on a strategic assessment to be completed by August 2011 with interim arrangement to be settled for protection of matters of national environmental significance, particularly the Carnaby's Black Cockatoo in place until August 2011"

Issues for resolution

- Area to which any agreement would apply
- Scope of the matters of national environmental significance within the agreement
- Arrangements for the operation of the agreement for various kinds of development subject to a different range of State approvals processes
- The Commonwealth's proposed offset framework, including ratios, Western Australia's role in implementation and costs
- Coinvestment, particularly in respect of the implementation of recovery plans for conservation of species and communities of national environmental significance
