The Department of Conservation and Land Management (CALM) and its predecessor have been planting and researching pine species in Western Australia for one hundred years. Today, the State's thriving pine processing industry is supplied from plantations across the south-west.

CALM's sharefarming unit was set up in 1994 to help meet growing demands for pine timber, as well as promote the landcare benefits of tree planting.

Sharefarming with CALM means pooling resources to grow Maritime pine crops on your property in strategic plantings alongside other crops and stock.

The land remains yours, the trees are planted and managed by CALM and the returns from three thinnings and the final harvest are shared.
