## 3. TREE FACILITIES

### 3.1 CALM FACILITIES

CALM is progressively establishing interpretive displays, signs and trails in national parks and state forest recreation areas. They are designed to enrich visitor awareness, enjoyment and understanding of the natural and cultural values of these areas.

Arboreta can be visited at Kalgoorlie, Pemberton, Big Brook (near Pemberton), Willow Springs (near Nannup), Bussell's Pine Arboreta (near Collie), Dryandra, Kununurra and Karratha.

CALM has nurseries at Narrogin, Manjimup and Broome.

The WA Herbarium, including a botanical garden, is in Hayman Road, Como.

Visitor Centres are at Milyering, Cape Range National Park and the Homestead, Millstream-Chichester National Park.
